The adoption of the 1967 Protocol removed temporal and geographic restrictions of the 1951 Convention, thus globalizing the refugee protection system. The 1967 Protocol recognized the significance of international cooperation. Exactly fifty years after its adoption, the international community is now engaged in efforts to promote international protection and durable solutions for refugees following the adoption of the New York Declaration for Refugees and Migrants in September 2016. This side event will examine examples and suggestions from NGOs on how to improve protection and self-reliance activities for refugees, as well as current issues in the Asia and the Pacfic region.
