Phase two – Restricted movement: All staff members and their families will be required to remain at home, unless otherwise instructed. No travel, incoming or within the country, will occur unless specifically authorized by the Designated Official as essential travel.

Phase three – Relocation: Indicates a substantial deterioration in the security situation, which may result in the relocation of staff members or their eligible dependants.

Phase four – Programme suspension: Apart from staff directly concerned with emergency or humanitarian relief operations or security matters, all other internationally recruited staff members who heretofore were considered essential to maintain programme activities will be evacuated.

Phase five – Evacuation: The decision to initiate Phase Five, declared following approval by the Secretary-General, signifies that the situation has deteriorated to such a point that all remaining internationally recruited staff members are required to leave.
