2.2 Administrative/Biographical	history In November 1953, the Ford Foundation approved a grant of \$50,000 to UNHCR to support a survey of the Chinese refugee situation in Hong Kong. The survey was to enable UNHCR "to ascertain as far as possible the number and position of the refugee groups among the Chinese population in Hong Kong, Kowloon, and the New Territories;" to determine the economic and social potential of the refugees; and to evolve a plan of action to alleviate their problem by methods of economic betterment, resettlement, and emigration.
	The UNHCR Hong Kong Survey Mission was established in 1954, with Dr. Edvard Hambro (former Registrar of the International Court of Justice) as the Chief of Mission. His Special Adviser was Dr. Gilbert Jaeger of UNHCR, with Dr. S. G. Davis as Economic Consultant and Fr. Paul J. Duchesne as Social Consultant. The work of the Survey Mission started in Hong Kong in May 1954, in association with the Hong Kong government. The office was in the Peninsula Hotel in Kowloon. A statistical report was completed on 31 August 1954; a final report was submitted to the High Commissioner in November 1954. The report was published in 1955 as "The Problem of the Chinese Refugees in Hong Kong."
2.3 Archival history	The records were probably brought to Geneva by Gilbert Jaeger when he returned from the mission.
3.1 Scope and content	The records include minutes of staff meetings, progress reports, drafts of reports on the economic and social conditions in Hong Kong, and copies of statistical reports. The records are clearly fragmentary.
3.3 Accruals	Accruals are not expected.
3.4 Arrangement	 The records are arranged in six file units: 1. Progress reports to Headquarters, May-June 1954 2. Summary records of staff meetings, May 1954 3. Outgoing correspondence, memoranda, notes to the file, May – Nov 1954 4. Fr. Paul J. Duchesne drafts for the final report, June 1954 5. Statistical report on the sample survey of Hong Kong's population, Aug 1954 6. Photographic prints of statistical tables on Chinese refugees in Hong Kong and Macao
