3.1 Scope and content	The records of the Pale Office consist of files from both the Pale Office and the BH-desk in Belgrade. During the war in Bosnia, UNHCR found it easier to reach the sites in eastern Bosnia by operations from Belgrade rather than from either Sarajevo or Zagreb. Consequently, UNHCR Belgrades BH-desk was operating as the Field Office for Eastern Bosnia & Herzegovina. The Pale Office had direct contact with the BH-desk, and they operated simultaneously with complementary functions. After the Dayton agreement, the staff from the BH-desk was relocated to Pale.
