# UNHCR Jordan Summary: Iraqi Adults Education and Occupation

#### I. Headlines

- 1. Iraqis registered with UNHCR in Jordan are well-educated and professional, as 35% have a university or post-university level degree and 38% were professionals.
- 2. There are three times as many professional Iraqis registered with UNHCR in Jordan than there are manual labourers.

### II. Iraqi Adults Registered with UNHCR Jordan: Education Level

- 3. 59.4% of Iraqi adults (21,935) have at least a high school diploma.
- 4. Of this, 35.0% (12,923) have a university or post-university level degree.
- 5. 33% (12,202) had some schooling but did not finish high school.
- 6. 7.6% (2,786) have informal education, no education or none listed.

### III. Iraqi Adults Registered with UNHCR Jordan: Occupation<sup>1</sup>

- 7. Out of 36,923 Iraqi adults,<sup>2</sup> 38.4% (14,169) were salaried professionals or educated workers.
- 8. 19.4% (7,168) are housewives (including about a dozen househusbands).
- 9. 13.1% (4,826) of Iraqi adults are students.
- 10. 12.8% (4,712) of Iraqi adults are manual laborers.
- 11. 11.8% (4,345) of Iraqi adults have occupation listed as unknown.
- 12. 4.6% (1,703) of Iraqi adults stated they had no occupation.
- 13. The largest categories of professional employment were business, industry and supply (2,724 or 20%); education (2,168 or 15%); medical, hospital, dental and public health (1,462 or 10%); engineering and architecture (1,397 or 10%); and general administration, clerical, and office services (1,352 or 10%).

### IV. Comparison of Educated Iraqis and Americans

14. Out of the adult population in the U.S., over 86% have completed high school, compared with 59% of Iraqis registered with UNHCR Jordan. However, 35% of Iraqi adults, compared to only 29% of American adults, have a university or post-university level degree.<sup>3</sup>




#### Education and Occupation Breakdown of Iraqis above 18 Years of Age Registered with UNHCR Jordan - Total: 36,923

• Iraqi adults registered with UNHCR in Jordan are well-educated and professional, as 35% have a university or higher-level degree and 38% were professionals.





• 38.4% of Iraqi adults in Jordan registered with UNHCR were salaried **professionals** or educated workers.

- **19.4%** of Iraqi adults are **housewives/husbands**.
- 13.1% of Iraqi adults are students.
- 12.8% of Iraqi adults are manual labourers.
- 11.8% of Iraqi adults did not state their occupation.
- 4.6% of Iraqi adults have no occupation listed.
