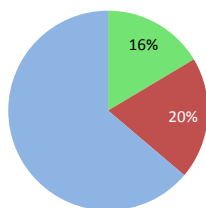

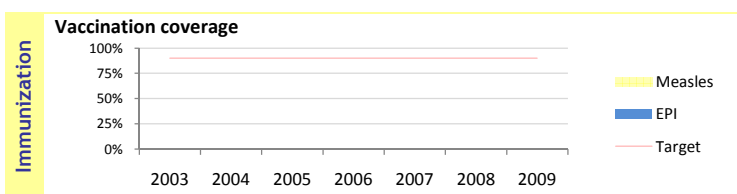

Observations

The Mozambican Ministry of Health is in charge of health services at Marratane camp. Malaria and acute respiratory infections are the main diseases that affected both children and adults throughout the reporting period. Long-lasting mosquito nets were distributed to all camp based refugees and to the local community surrounding the camp along with a sensitization campaign. UNHCR is in charge of food distribution in the camp for the vulnerable cases; the general population receives half rations (969 Kcal per person per day). All refugees have been allocated land and are able to produce their own food. No JAMs and nutritional surveys were conducted during 2009.
