



## Selected Distress at Sea Incidents involving Refugees and Migrants in 2011

The following provides an overview of selected distress at sea incidents involving persons of concern to UNHCR in several regions between 1 January 2011 and 31 October 2011. It is based on desk research of publicly available media sources conducted between August and October 2011. It is not exhaustive, nor has UNHCR verified the information. The objective of the table is to indicate the nature and scale of distress at sea incidents across the world. The disproportionately high number of incidents in the Mediterranean reflected in the table is partly due to the humanitarian emergency in Libya and a high number of resulting departures in the first half of 2011. In addition, it seems that information on rescue at sea incidents in the Mediterranean region is more accessible than in other regions. The table is focused on distress at sea situations, and does not include interception cases or general irregular arrivals by sea.
