The Global Shelter Cluster (GSC) has made significant progress over the last decade in coordinating humanitarian shelter actors in both advanced preparedness actions and disaster response. Looking forward, the GSC recognizes that, in a changing humanitarian landscape, shelter responses, if not the entire sector, will need to adapt accordingly. Both the World Humanitarian Summit and the New Urban Agenda adopted at the United Nations Conference on Housing and Sustainable Urban Development (Habitat III) highlighted priorities requiring a new way of working with better linkages to developmental outcomes.
