

Situation Update

Some the 101,848 refugees from Karabakh have been registered by Armenian authorities since 24 September 2023. On 26 October 2023, the Government adopted a decision granting temporary protection to refugees from Karabakh for one year. As most refugees have arrived in Armenia with nearly no personal belongings, they require urgent assistance

including cash, shelter, non-food and essential items, as well as medical and psychosocial support.

UNHCR's Emergency Response Protection:

- Starting 1 November 2023, UNHCR will begin a six-week household protection monitoring exercise, which will target 2,500 refugees from Karabakh. Based on information gathered, UNHCR will produce an analysis of trends, potential protection risks, vulnerabilities and needs among respondents.

- Since 1 October 2023, UNHCR's hotline
 received over 1,500 calls from refugees from Karabakh, including 200 calls
 from 20 26 October 2023. 48% of refugees highlighted the need for
 accommodation, while 27% required bedding items, 25% food items, 18%
 household items, 10% hygiene kits, 8% access to healthcare.
- So far, UNHCR has visited 56 communities in various provinces and spoke with +121 refugee households, referring them to specialized services and ensuring that refugees with urgent needs had been included on the NFI distribution list.

Shelter and Non-Food Items (NFIs):

- Between 3 27 October 2023, UNHCR through partner Mission Armenia provided 24,235 NFIs (pillows, hygiene kits, blankets, folding beds, solar lamps, bedding linen, mattresses, kitchen sets and other NFIs) to 2,087 refugee households residing in various provinces across the country. In the coming days UNHCR will start distributing 1,700 winter gloves from a private sector partnership donation.
- Since 30 September 2023, **28 trucks** with NFIs have arrived in Armenia and **34,000 NFIs** have been distributed to refugees in various provinces.

Coordination

On 25 October 2023, the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs (MLSA) and UNHCR facilitated the first **Basic Needs Coordination meeting**, covering Food, Shelter and NFIs Sectors under the <u>Armenia Refugee response Plan</u> (RRP). Participants presented their plans for the response, aiming to harmonize the coordination of the NFI distribution, and supporting with an accommodation technical assessment. MSLA and UNHCR co-chaired the **Protection Sector** meeting on 27 October, which discussed support services to refugees. On 31 October, the **Resilience Sector** looked at employment policies, business support and financial access initiatives.
