In 2013, He joined the UN Agency for Refugees (UNHCR) during the Syrian refugee influx to Iraq, in the capacity of National officer, acting as head of a field unit. He worked in Iraq, Serbia, Greece, Turkey, and at the RB in Bangkok, Thailand. Most of his career was in response to different emergencies or covering a specific crisis in the field. Before joining UNHCR, he was an internally displaced person with his family for some time. They again found themselves internally displaced in 2014 when terrorists took a large area of their country. Thus, working for UNHCR is not a mere career; he believes in what the agency is doing to protect the forcibly displaced people. He graduated in 1996 with a BA degree in Arts. He worked in the public sector, mainly as an English teacher in secondary schools and later in the university, before joining the International NGOs in 2007. He is married and has four children, and they live together in Bangkok.
