A GLOBAL CRISIS OF FORCED DISPLACEMENT

110 MILLION FORCIBLY DISPLACED PEOPLE IN 2023

X2 THE NUMBER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE SINCE 2011

110 million people in the world are fleeing war, violence or persecution. If they were a country, they would have a population almost as large as Egypt's or the Philippines'. Times 2 in 10 years. The number of displaced people in the world has doubled in the past decade. In 2013, there were around 51 million, in 2023 there were over 110 million.

62.5 MILLION INTERNALLY DISPLACED

62.5 million people in the world are internally displaced. This means that well over half of the people fleeing violence, war or persecution have never left their own country.

1 in 74 PEOPLE IN DE WORLD ARE DISPLACED

Over 110 million people in the world have been forced to flee their homes. That means 1 in every 74 persons on earth has been forcibly displaced by conflict, war or persecution.
