Introduction

1. This brief reports provides an overview of refugee trends in 70 countries for which UNHCR country offices had reported statistics to UNHCR Headquarters by the end of June 2004. The 70 countries included are mostly developing countries where UNHCR has operations.¹ The main purpose of this report is to provide updated statistics for individual countries and operations.² Trends in the number of refugee status applications and decisions in these 70 asylum countries are analyzed separately in the document *Trends in Refugee Status Determination, 1 January – 31 March 2004*. The statistics presented here should be considered as provisional, subject to change. The country codes used in the tables are explained in Annex I.

CHANGES IN THE REFUGEE POPULATION

2. In the 70 asylum countries considered here, the refugee population remained remarkably stable. During the first quarter of 2004, the refugee population in these 70 countries combined fell by 1%, from 3,556,000 as at 1 January 2004 to 3,513,000 as at 31 March 2004. The refugee population directly assisted by or through UNHCR decreased by 5%, from 2.19 million at the beginning to 2.06 million at the end of the period (see *Table 1*).

3. Among the 31 countries hosting more than 5,000 refugees at the end of the period, only one recorded an **increase** in the refugee population of 5% or more. In Ecuador, a 7% increase was recorded following an influx of 511 Colombian refugees. Other larger refugee nationalities recording an important increase during the first quarter of 2004 included Sudanese in Egypt (6.5%), Eritrean refugees in Ethiopia (10.5%) and refugees from the Democratic Republic of Congo in Uganda (8%) and Zambia (23%) (see *Tables 1 and 2*).

4. Two countries hosting more than 5,000 refugees recorded a **decrease** in the refugee population of at least 5%. In Russia, the refugee figure fell by 49% following a decrease of some 4,000 refugees from Georgia. In Zambia, 7% fewer refugees were reported, partly due to a decrease in Angolan refugee population (-38,200). It is likely that the latter change is linked to the large-scale voluntary repatriation of Angolan refugees.

5. Other larger refugee nationalities recording an important decrease during the first quarter of 2004 included Sierra Leoneans in Guinea (-32%) as a result of voluntary repatriation and Burundi refugees in the United Republic of Tanzania (-5%) (see *Tables 1 and 2*).

NEW ARRIVALS

6. Among the 70 asylum countries included here, **new arrivals** involving more than 500 refugees were reported by nine countries, including Yemen (7,200), Uganda (2,700), Egypt (1,500), Zambia (1,250), the United Republic of Tanzania (900), Ethiopia (880), Turkey (590), Cote d'Ivoire (550) and Ecuador (520) (see *Table 1*).

7. These outflows concerned mostly refugees from Somalia fleeing Yemen (7,200) and refugees from Sudan fleeing to Uganda (1,500) and Egypt (1,200) (see *Tables 2 and 3*).

DURABLE SOLUTIONS

8. **Voluntary repatriation** departures involving more than 1,000 refugees³ were reported by the UNHCR country offices located in the United Rep. of Tanzania (25,300 Burundian refugees), Guinea (7,900 refugees from Sierra Leone) and Uganda (1,100 Rwandan refugees) (see *Tables 1 and 4*).

9. UNHCR offices in the 70 asylum countries included in this report resettled some 4,200 refugees during the first three months of 2004, 8 of which facilitated more than 100 departures. Most **resettlement departures** facilitated by UNHCR took place from Cote d'Ivoire (1,357), Egypt (910), Turkey (650), Ethiopia (155), Malaysia (150), Jordan (120), Russia (110) and Lebanon (105) (see *Table 1*).

10. Within these 70 first asylum countries, the nationalities benefiting mostly from resettlement facilitated by UNHCR included refugees from Liberia (1,370), Sudan (1,105), the Islamic Rep. of Iran (550), Iraq (190), Afghanistan (160) and Myanmar (125).
