Introduction

1. This brief reports provides an overview of refugee trends in 81 countries for which UNHCR country offices had reported statistics to UNHCR Headquarters by the beginning of September 2004. The 81 countries included are mostly developing countries where UNHCR has operations.¹ The main purpose of this report is to provide updated statistics for individual countries and operations.² Trends in the number of refugee status applications and decisions in these 81 asylum countries are analyzed separately in the document *Trends in Refugee Status Determination, 1 January – 30 June 2004*. The statistics presented here should be considered as provisional, subject to change. The country codes used in the tables are explained in Annex I.

CHANGES IN THE REFUGEE POPULATION

2. In the 81 asylum countries considered here, the refugee population remained fairly stable. During the first six months of 2004, the refugee population in these 81 countries combined increased by 4 per cent, from 5,471,000 as at 1 January 2004 to 5,682,000 as at 30 June 2004. The refugee population directly assisted by or through UNHCR increased by 5 per cent, from 4.2 million at the beginning to 4.4 million at the end of the period (see *Table 1*).

3. Among the 37 countries hosting more than 5,000 refugees at the end of the period, five recorded an **increase** in the refugee population of 5 per cent or more. Increases in Burundi (48%) and Rwanda (8%) were observed following an influx of 19,500 refugees to Burundi and 3,200 to Rwanda from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DR Congo). In the Islamic Republic of Iran, the refugee population estimate increased by 37 per cent (575,000 refugees) following a registration conducted by the host country at the end of 2003. Ecuador faced a 14 per cent increase, mainly caused by recognition of 1,000 Columbian refugees. Other larger refugee nationalities recording an important increase during the first six months of 2004 included Sudanese in Egypt (11%), Eritrean refugees in Ethiopia (18%) and refugees from the DR Congo in Uganda (19%) (see *Tables 1 and 2*).

4. Four countries hosting more than 5,000 refugees recorded a **decrease** in the refugee population of at least 5 per cent, see main explanations below under Durable Solutions. In the Republic of Congo, a decline of 25 per cent was observed. In Guinea, the number of refugees decreased by 15 per cent. Pakistan observed a 5 per cent decline in its refugee population following the repatriation of 192,500 Afghans. In the United Republic of Tanzania the total number of refugees decreased by 7 per cent.

5. Other larger refugee nationalities recording an important decrease during the first six months of 2004 included Iraqi refugees in the Islamic Republic of Iran (-17%), and Somalians in Ethiopia (-17%) (see *Tables 1 and 2*).

NEW ARRIVALS

6. Among the 81 asylum countries included here, **new arrivals** involving more than 1,000 refugees were reported by 12 countries, including Burundi (19,400), Uganda (8,400), Yemen

(8,100), Rwanda (3,200), Egypt (3,000), Ethiopia (2,200), Sierra Leone (1,600), the United Republic of Tanzania (1,100), and Ecuador (1,100) (see *Table 1*).

7. These outflows concerned mostly refugees from DR Congo fleeing to Burundi (19,400), Rwanda (3,200) and Uganda (2,000), refugees from Somalia fleeing to Yemen (8,100), refugees from Sudan fleeing to Uganda (6,000) and Egypt (2,400), and Liberian refugees fleeing to Sierra Leone (1,600). In addition, Eritrean refugees fled to Ethiopia (1,200) and Colombians to Ecuador (1,000) (see *Tables 2 and 3*).

DURABLE SOLUTIONS

8. **Voluntary repatriation** departures involving more than 1,000 refugees³ were reported by the UNHCR country offices located in the Islamic Republic of Iran (210,000, of which 184,000 to Afghanistan and 26,000 to Iraq), Pakistan (192,000 to Afghanistan), the United Republic of Tanzania (52,200 refugees to Burundi), Guinea (11,500 refugees to Sierra Leone) and Uganda (1,100 refugees to Rwanda) (see *Tables 1 and 4*).

9. UNHCR offices in the 81 asylum countries included in this report resettled some 9,300 refugees during the first six months of 2004, 20 of which facilitated more than 100 departures. Most **resettlement departures** facilitated by UNHCR took place from Côte d'Ivoire (3,160), Egypt (2,140), The United Republic of Tanzania (605), The Islamic Republic of Iran (530), Ethiopia (330), Pakistan (290), Lebanon (270), Sierra Leone (220), India (220), and Russia (215) (see *Table 1*).

10. Within these 81 first asylum countries, the nationalities benefiting mostly from resettlement facilitated by UNHCR included refugees from Liberia (3,470), Sudan (2,395), Afghanistan (1,150), and DR Congo (500).
