Introduction

1. This brief reports provides an overview of refugee trends in 84 countries for which UNHCR country offices had reported statistics to UNHCR Headquarters by mid June 2005. The 84 countries included are mostly developing countries where UNHCR has operations.¹ The main purpose of this report is to provide updated statistics for individual countries and operations.² Trends in the number of refugee status applications and decisions in these 84 asylum countries are analyzed separately in the document *Trends in Refugee Status Determination, 1 January – 31 March 2005*. The statistics presented here should be considered as provisional, subject to change. The country codes used in the tables are explained in Annex I.

CHANGES IN THE REFUGEE POPULATION

2. In the 84 asylum countries considered here, the refugee population continued to decline. During the first quarter of 2005, the refugee population in these 84 countries combined decreased by 3%, from 4,935,000 as at 1 January 2005 to 4,772,000 as at 31 March 2005. The refugee population directly assisted by or through UNHCR decreased by 7%, from 3.24 million at the beginning to 3.02 million at the end of the period (see *Table 1*).

3. Among the 39 countries hosting more than 5,000 refugees at the end of the period, four recorded an **increase** in the refugee population of 5% or more. In the Syrian Arab Republic the refugee population increased by 19% due to an increase of 3,000 refugees from Iraq. Malaysia reported an increase of 18% due to increases of some 3,200 refugees from Indonesia, and 1,400 from Myanmar. Finally the number of refugees in Uganda increased by almost 10% due to increases of almost 26,000 refugees from Sudan and 4,000 from the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Some other larger refugee nationalities recording an important increase during the first quarter of 2005 included Angolans in Zambia (2.8%), and Somalis in Yemen (1.9%) (see *Tables 1 and 2*).

4. Five countries hosting more than 5,000 refugees recorded a **decrease** in the refugee population of at least 5%. In Serbia and Montenegro, the refugee figure fell by 45% following a decrease of some 76,000 refugees from Croatia, and 48,000 refugees from Bosnia and Herzegovina. In Djibouti, 13% fewer refugees were reported due to voluntary repatriation of some 2,300 Somali refugees. The refugee population in the Democratic Republic of the Congo decreased by 11% after voluntary repatriation of 18,300 Sudanese refugees, and 1,800 Rwandan refugees. In Namibia a 10% decrease is mainly explained by the voluntary repatriation of 1,300 Angolans. Finally, Turkmenistan reported a 10% decrease mainly from a reduction in the number Tajik refugees in the country.

5. Other larger refugee nationalities recording an important decrease during the first quarter of 2005 included Rwandans in Uganda (-25%), and Somali refugees in Ethiopia (-5%) (see *Tables 1 and 2*).

NEW ARRIVALS

6. Among the 84 asylum countries included here, **new arrivals** involving more than 500 refugees were reported by eight countries, including Yemen (5,800), Uganda (9,000), Syrian Arab Republic (3,100), Chad (1,500), Ethiopia (740), Malaysia (660), Ecuador (550), and the United Rep. of Tanzania (530) (see *Table 1*).

7. These outflows concerned mostly refugees from Somalia fleeing to Yemen (5,800) and refugees from Sudan fleeing to Uganda (5,300) and Chad (1,500), refugees fleeing from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (3,800), and Iraqis arriving in the Syrian Arab Republic (1,500) (see *Tables 2 and 3*).

DURABLE SOLUTIONS

8. **Voluntary repatriation** departures involving more than 1,000 refugees³ were reported by the UNHCR country offices located in the Islamic Republic of Iran (34,200), the Democratic Republic of the Congo (21,500), United Rep. of Tanzania (7,900), Ethiopia (2,800), Djibouti (2,300), Sierra Leone (1,400), and Namibia (1,300) (see *Tables 1 and 4*).

9. UNHCR offices in the 84 asylum countries included in this report resettled some 2,400 refugees during the first three months of 2005, nine of which facilitated more than 100 departures. Most **resettlement departures** facilitated by UNHCR took place from United Rep. of Tanzania (370), Egypt (350), Turkey (330), Ethiopia (250), Cote d'Ivoire (150), Malaysia (150), Lebanon (140), and Ecuador (100) (see *Table 1*).

10. Within these 84 first asylum countries, the nationalities benefiting mostly from resettlement facilitated by UNHCR included refugees from Sudan (490), the Islamic Rep. of Iran (320), Burundi (300), Afghanistan (290), Eritrea (170), Liberia (160), and Colombia (110).
