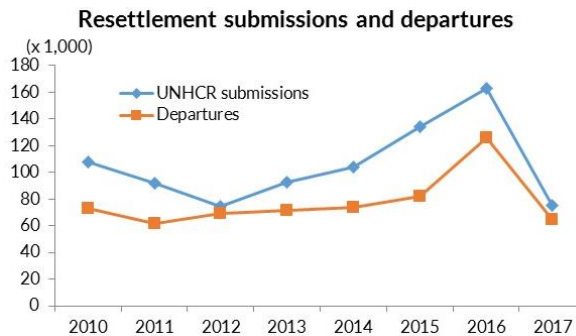




# 2017 in review

Against a change in the global resettlement landscape which has been characterized by fluctuations in state quotas, UNHCR was provided with resettlement places for only 75,188 refugees in 2017, a 54 per cent drop compared to 2016 (163,206). As such, 2017 witnessed the first drop in available resettlement places after four consecutive years of significant increases leading up to the 20-year high recorded in 2016.

A total of 83 UNHCR operations referred refugees to resettlement States in 2017. Turkey, Lebanon and Jordan were the top three, driven mainly by the Syrian refugee crisis and together accounting for more than half (52%) of all submissions worldwide. Syrians also constituted the largest refugee population to be submitted for resettlement by UNHCR in 2017 (37,332 or 50% of all submissions).

The United States continued to be the main recipient of UNHCR's resettlement submissions in 2017 (26,782), despite recording a 75 per cent drop compared to 2016 (108,197 submissions). Despite this decrease, more than one third (38%) of all departures recorded during the year were to the United States (24,559).

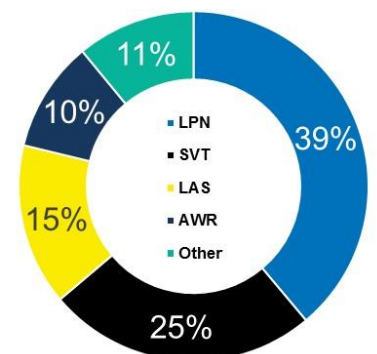

Of the 1.19 million refugees in need of resettlement, UNHCR had planned to submit close to 170,000 in 2017. However, the absence of sufficient quotas provided by States resulted in a lower number of resettlement submissions in 2017.
