



Communications (EU Visibility) Internship UNHCR Representation for EU Affairs, Belgium, Ireland, Luxembourg and the Netherlands

UNHCR, the UN Refugee Agency, is a global organization dedicated to saving lives, protecting rights and building a better future for people forced to flee their homes because of conflict and persecution. We lead international action to protect refugees, forcibly displaced communities and stateless people. We deliver life-saving assistance, help safeguard fundamental human rights, and develop solutions that ensure people have a safe place called home where they can build a better future. We also work to ensure that stateless people are granted a nationality. We work in over 130 countries, using our expertise to protect and care for millions.

The EU Visibility Team, based at the Representation for EU Affairs, Belgium, Ireland, Luxembourg and the Netherlands (REUA) is seeking a Communications Intern (EU visibility) for six months, starting in September 2021.

The team supports UNHCR operations (globally) in their communications and visibility activities, and profiles the UNHCR - EU partnership in Brussels and beyond. This entails close liaison with the European Commission, UNHCR operations (globally), regional bureaux and UNHCR headquarters.

What we offer

- A full-time six-month internship, starting from September 2021
- The intern will receive a Food and Local Transportation Allowance (FLTA), up to USD 1,000 per month, payable in local currency. The Food and Local Transportation Allowance is provided to non-sponsored interns only. In cases where a sponsored intern receives funding (less than the amount of allowance described above) from the sponsoring institution or another sponsor, UNHCR will pay the difference between this amount and the above allowance, if any
- Experience with a UN agency
- Work in a dynamic, international environment
- Learning about donor relations, refugee and statelessness issues.

General description of internship

- Assisting in the day-to-day activities of the team and supporting longer and shorter-term projects including EU visibility requests.
- Supporting with the production of social media content including videos, infographics, macros.
- Assisting with the organization and hosting of campaigns and events.
- Providing administrative assistance, as required

Requisite educational and administrative criteria

In order to be considered eligible for an internship, the following criteria must be fulfilled:

- Be a recent graduate (i.e. have completed studies within one year of applying) from a university or higher education facility accredited by UNESCO
- Have no direct family ties with a UNHCR staff member (including Temporary Appointment holder) nor with a member of the Affiliate Workforce.
- Excellent command of English;
- Creative flair and enthusiasm for design;
- Creative skills including Adobe Creative Cloud, Canva etc.;
- Strong drafting and organizational skills;
- Team player and professional approach; and
- Interest in forced displacement and statelessness issues or evidence of previous experience in this field or within EU institutions.

Interested applicants should submit their letter of motivation (maximum 1 page) and CV to belbrhr@unhcr.org with 'EU Visibility intern_Applicant's SURNAME' in the subject.

Applicants should clearly state in their covering letter or email their availability and their awareness of the conditions of eligibility criteria as set out in this vacancy notice.
