Registration, Refugee Status Determination and Resettlement

-  **32,488** individuals received new and continuous registration services
-  **1** mobile registration mission in the North Coast
-  **3,202** RSD interviews conducted
-  **3,059** RSD decisions finalized
-  **1,157** persons departed to **6** countries



Community-based Protection and Communication with Communities

-  **73,431** calls responded to by UNHCR Egypt infoline
-  **1,885** persons with specific needs were supported
-  **7** meetings organized, attended by **326** community leaders
-  **203** refugee and Egyptian learners benefitted from five computer learning centres
-  **112,636** times the Help website was accessed
-  **273,140** reached on two UNHCR-run Facebook pages
-  **3** live Q&A sessions organized to respond to refugee questions



Gender-based Violence

-  **1,103** women, men, girls and boys attended different GBV awareness activities


Child Protection

-  **1,677** unaccompanied and separated children (UASC) provided with case management services
-  **465** best interests assessments conducted for UASC and for children at risk



Legal Assistance

-  **1,047** received counseling, legal assistance & support with child birth registration
-  **240** released from detention following UNHCR's intervention

Protection Counselling

-  **3,181** benefited from protection counselling



Cash-based Interventions (CBI)

-  **10,872** families were supported with multipurpose CBI
-  **2,827** UASC received CBI to mitigate protection risks & meet basic needs






Health

-  **8,829** persons with non-communicable diseases were treated
-  **27,105** received primary health assistance
-  **683** life-saving emergencies attended to
-  **4,556** medical referrals for secondary and tertiary healthcare
-  **1** call center has been delivered to the Ministry of Health

Livelihoods

-  **871** received training sessions, guidance on labour market opportunities, job placement services
-  **68** refugees started/enlarged their businesses with UNHCR support

Education

-  **36,563** school students received education grants
-  **30** public schools are part of the Instant School Networks project
-  **400** refugee youth supported to continue their higher education
-  **429** differently-abled children enrolled in schools
-  **638** UASC enrolled in schools
