

# RMS Standard Questionnaire overview

*version 3: August 2023 – for use during scale-up in 2023*

The Results Monitoring Surveys (RMS) facilitate and harmonise monitoring of survey-based impact and outcome level indicators, ensure evidence-based reporting against multi-year strategies and support us in demonstrating our results to stakeholders. The RMS are household-level surveys with standard questionnaire modules tailored to local Results Frameworks and related survey-based data needs. The questionnaire is based on international standards where applicable and has in some instances been adapted to UNHCR's needs and, for the purpose of the RMS, shortened to limit scope strictly to requirements for indicator calculation.<sup>1</sup>

This document provides an overview of the RMS standard questionnaire version 3 (RMS Qv3), including:

- A) an overview of indicators that are covered by the RMS Qv3 along with question sources and variable names,
- B) an overview of the basic structure of the RMS Qv3, and
- C) the paper-based version of the RMS Qv3 itself.

Please note that this paper-based version is made available to provide an overview of questionnaire content as well as guidance on questions that should not be modified and those where answer options can or should be contextualised. However, as minor wording differences might have occurred during editing and translation processes, the **XLSForm version should be considered the original source for tailor designing your own RMS.**

The XLSForm version is available for face-to-face and phone-based surveys (for [CAPI](#) and [CATI](#)) and is compatible with [KoBo](#).

The RMS Qv3 is available in English, French, Spanish and Arabic. Translation into other languages should be carried out following the [RMS translation protocol](#).

## B. Basic structure of the RMS standard questionnaire

The RMS standard questionnaire has four main parts with corresponding sections as listed below.

### Part 0. Introduction – Interview Visits

Respondent : Enumerator

- Interview Visits
- Consent form
- Basic household information

### PART 1. Individual level questions

Respondent: Household head or another knowledgeable adult member

- Household roster
- Mobility (for RAS, VDA, RET, STA and OOC, as applicable) }
- IDPs (for IDPs)
- Official documentation
- Vaccination of children under 5
- Disability
- Access to health services
- Education

The sections on mobility and IDPs aim to validate the sampling frame and to perform the statistical classification of different categories of population groups. It can be particularly useful to perform listing exercises where sampling frames are absent or incomplete.

Operations can decide to omit these sections in case a clear sampling frame exists that already classifies population groups. It is for each operation to decide whether these questions are sensitive in taking into account their particular protection contexts at the time of interviews.

### PART 2. Information on the well-being of the household

Respondent: Household head or another knowledgeable adult member

- Shelter quality
- Land and housing rights
- Availability of basic services
- Availability of health services
- Social Protection

### PART 3. Individual-level questionnaire

Respondent: A randomly sampled adult in the household

- Unemployment and income
- Perceptions on safety and GBV

### End Survey

Respondent: Enumerator

An **adult** is defined as someone aged 18+ for the purposes of administering this questionnaire. An operation may decide, depending on particular contexts, to administer this questionnaire to adolescents aged 15 to 17 depending on the local context and taking into account necessary consent as applicable.

## C. Paper-based version of the RMS standard questionnaire v3

### Contextualization:

This questionnaire covers relevant survey-based impact and outcome indicators. It needs to be adapted in line with each operation's specific data needs and Results Framework. The standard questionnaire highlights questions that will require contextualization to reflect local realities.

### Greeting and reading of rights:

**THIS STATEMENT IS TO BE READ TO THE HEAD OF THE HOUSEHOLD OR, IF THEY ARE ABSENT, ANOTHER ADULT MEMBER OF THE HOUSE BEFORE THE INTERVIEW. IN CASE OF PHONE SURVEYS, IT SHOULD BE DIRECTED TO THE PERSON WHO PICKS UP THE PHONE. DEFINE THE HEAD OF HOUSEHOLD AS A MEMBER OF THE FAMILY WHO MANAGES THE FAMILY RESOURCES AND IS THE FINAL DECISION MAKER IN THE HOUSE.**

Hello. My name is [name of enumerator] and I work with [organization/institution]. UNHCR is sponsoring a survey to learn more about the overall well-being of forcibly displaced and stateless persons in [country of enumeration] and to inform the improvement of programmes. If you decide not to participate in this survey, or if you withdraw from participating at any time, you will not be penalized in any way.

Before we start to ask you any questions, we will ask you to give us your verbal consent. Be assured that any information that you will provide will be kept strictly confidential – the data you will provide will be anonymized so no data of a particular household or individual can be identified. Please note that the information you give here is purely used for statistical purposes and by no means would affect your status determination. You can ask me any question that you have about this survey before you decide to participate or not.

If you do not understand the information or if your questions were not answered to your satisfaction, do not declare your consent on this form.
