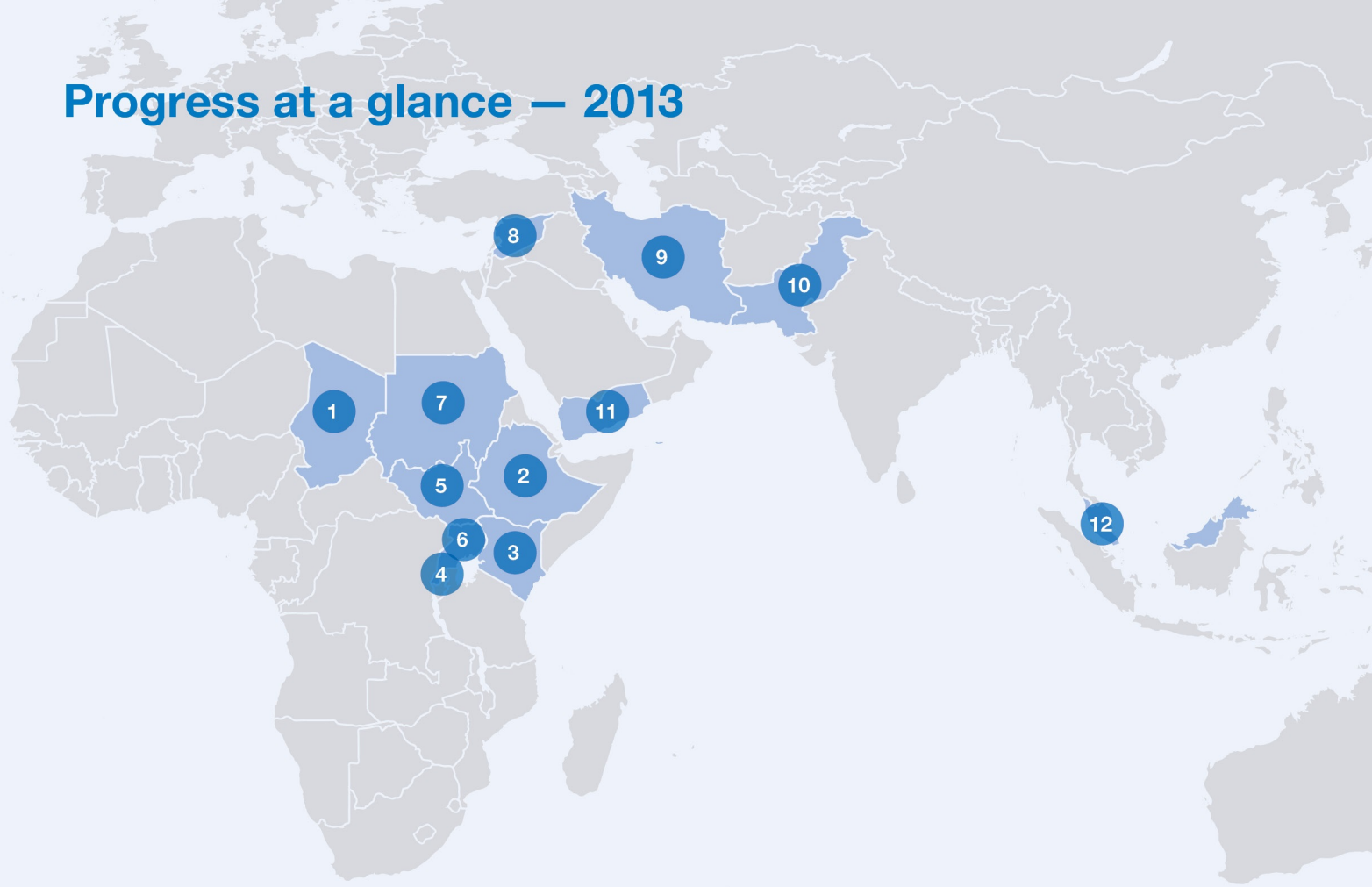


# Progress at a glance — 2013



- 1 Chad: 13,103 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary school  
**Country of origin:** Sudan and Central African Republic

  - 167 refugee teachers trained in a national teacher training institute
  - 54 classrooms constructed, including 1 new primary school
  - 2,398 children sat for the primary-leaving exam
- 2 Ethiopia: 38,450 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary school  
**Country of origin:** South Sudan and the Horn of Africa

  - 6,014 children enrolled in accelerated education program
  - 15,000 textbooks distributed
  - 35,450 children provided with school uniforms
- 3 Kenya: 43,062 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary school  
**Country of origin:** Somalia, South Sudan and other nationalities

  - 355 children with disabilities assisted at school
  - 347 teachers trained
  - 40 classrooms constructed & 30 classrooms rehabilitated
- 4 Rwanda: 6,236 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary school  
**Country of origin:** Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)

  - 12 classrooms constructed
  - 4,108 children enrolled in an accelerated education program with a focus on language acquisition
  - 125 teachers trained
- 5 South Sudan: 31,525 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary school  
**Country of origin:** Sudan

  - 128 classrooms constructed in the camps and 3 primary schools constructed in the host community
  - 3,529 learners enrolled in an accelerated education program
  - 400 refugee teachers trained
- 6 Uganda: 18,369 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary school  
**Country of origin:** Democratic Republic of Congo, South Sudan and other nationalities

  - 16 classrooms constructed
  - 295 female teachers recruited
  - 25 schools supported to participate in the Newspapers in Education program
- 7 Sudan: 17,371 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary school  
**Country of origin:** Eritrea, Chad, Ethiopia and other nationalities

  - 3 primary schools and 1 pre-primary school constructed
  - 200 children assisted with school fees
  - 155 teachers trained
- 8 Syria: 9,164 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary education  
**Country of origin:** Iraq and other nationalities

  - 9,164 children assisted through education cash grants
  - 1 assessment conducted via phone to assess the impact of cash grants and educational access
  - 43 Outreach Volunteers disseminated relevant information on education despite insecurity
- 9 Iran: 66,030 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary school  
**Country of origin:** Afghanistan

  - 1 school and 5 classrooms constructed
  - 24,159 hygiene kits and 12,944 uniforms distributed
  - 4,600 vulnerable children assisted with cash grants
- 10 Pakistan: 15,124 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary school  
**Country of origin:** Afghanistan

  - 51 classrooms rehabilitated
  - 16,063 girls supported with uniforms, school bags and school materials
  - 214 teachers trained and 1,334 teachers' salaries paid
- 11 Yemen: 3,511 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary school  
**Country of origin:** Somalia and other nationalities

  - 1,000 children assisted with school fees and 51 students with disabilities supported
  - 1,468 children assisted with school uniforms and school kits
  - 56 teachers and 8 student councils trained
- 12 Malaysia: 4,138 refugee children** enrolled and retained in primary school  
**Country of origin:** Myanmar and other nationalities

  - 26 learning centers renovated and 119 centers provided with cash grants to support the purchase of teaching and learning materials
  - 168 teachers trained and 191 teachers paid incentives
  - 14,400 textbooks and 6,126 uniforms distributed
