General comments on the evaluation:	UNHCR UK welcomes the evaluation of the Quality Integration Project (QIP). The evaluation was timely, took into account the views of a diverse range of actors involved with the QIP, and was guided by a highly qualified reference group. UNHCR UK is of the view that the evidence gathered was thoughtfully and fairly considered and the recommendations provided are reasonable. We appreciate recognition of the constructive role that the QIP has had in the UK and that its work should continue. At the same time, we share the views outlined in the evaluation regarding the value in strengthening aspects of the project, including its governance structure. As outlined below, UNHCR and the Home Office have already commenced work in this area and will seek to make further progress over the coming months. Similarly, there is ongoing engagement with stakeholders and internal work to strengthen communication and coordination on the UK's and other QI projects, however, it is recognised that more can be done in these areas. UNHCR UK is in agreement with the four recommendations.
