hearing aids for students with hearing disabilities

- 1- Hearing aid shall be placed behind the ear.
- 2- Hearing aids shall have at least 8 channels.
- 3- Hearing aids shall have at least 4 programs.
- 4- Hearing aids shall be suitable for students with hearing disabilities for the age group (12-20 years old).
- 5- Hearing aids shall be suitable for students with hearing disabilities that ranges from mild to severe.
- 6- A directional microphone to improve speech intelligibility.
- 7- Reduce noise, improve volume, and clear speech.
- 8- Reduce loud sounds and increases clarity of sound.
- 9- Modulation of frequencies to improve sound quality and clear speech.
- 10- Hearing aids shall have a muffler to control noises and hissing.
- 11- The ability to program hearing aids according to the degree of hearing loss of students with hearing disabilities.
- 12- The ability to gradually amplify the sound for auditory and speech adaptation.
- 13- Using hearing aids to build audio and speaking adaptation skills.
- 14- Hearing aids that provide safety and comfort.
- 15- The manufacturer shall provide a certificate indicating the number of programs, channels, year of manufacture, country of origin and the time of model's manufacturing.
- 16- Water, dust, and moisture resistant.
- 17- Each hearing aid shall be included with battery packs containing (10) strips of around (60 batteries).
- 18- Two-year parts and maintenance warranty.

Technical Service provided by the Company:


- 1- The company shall visit students at their sites, and carries out regular preventive maintenance every 3 months, including the provision of spare parts, examination of hearing aids, and the elimination of moisture and dust.
- 2- Programming hearing aids using a computer software, not manually.
- 3- Obliging the company to provide the following:
 - Conducting an auditory examination and audiogram for each student.
 - Moulding.
 - Change the pipes connecting the hearing aid to the mould.
