FOR LEASING OF OFFICE BUILDING IN BEIRUT**

1. INTRODUCTION TO UNHCR

2. SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

The Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), in Beirut, Lebanon invites qualified Real Estate/Property Agents and landlords, registered with the Government of Lebanon (GoL) to make a firm offer for leasing of office building in Beirut (referred to hereinafter as "service").

2.1 The property (Building) we are looking for, should be compliant with the characteristics listed in **Annex A**.

Payment terms:

Products/services purchased through a Purchase Order will be paid through an offshore bank transfer to the bank account of the Frame Agreement holder, within 30 days upon delivery and submission of validated invoices. Please note that all quoted prices shall be exclusive of all taxes, since the United Nations, is exempt from taxes.

The EOI must include, as a minimum, the following documentation / information:

- building title deed and registration certificate.
- Company/owner contact details (address, telephone and fax numbers, email etc)
- Official and legal registration of the real estate agent.
- Maps of property and pictures.
- A full description of the suggested building such as:
 - Spreadsheets of surfaces in square meters or square feet
- General Information on rental conditions
- Fully filled and signed Annex A and B.

UNHCR will review the responses and may seek further clarifications and information from certain respondents. These requests for clarifications or information may take the form of communication by telephone, in writing or e-mails. UNHCR will not bear any costs relating to the preparation and submission of the EOI responses.

5. Important Notice:

The EOI does not constitute a solicitation. UNHCR reserves the right to change or cancel the requirements at any time during the EOI and / or solicitation process. Thus, submitting a response to this EOI does not automatically guarantee that your company will be considered for contract awarding.

The expression of interest must be communicated directly by the landlord or the agent representing the landlord who is a holder of a valid power of attorney. Kindly be informed that the UNHCR does not subscribe to agent fees under any circumstances, and this is to be stipulated in the contract.
