

## New measures to fight the spread of COVID-19

### From 29<sup>th</sup> March 2021:

- New travel restrictions: All arrivals travelling into Malta from other countries will need to produce a **negative PCR test taken no longer than 72 hours** before arrival in Malta.
- Passengers who arrive without a test will be required to take a **PCR test in Malta. Anyone who refuses to take the test or tests positive for COVID-19 will be subject to quarantine.**

### From 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021:

- Groups of more than 2 persons are prohibited, unless the group of people live in the same household. People may **not gather in groups of more than two persons in public spaces**, including in queues and at bus stops, unless social distancing of 2 metres is maintained.
- The fine for those who break the regulation is being raised to **€300** from the current €100.

**These measures will remain in place until 11<sup>th</sup> April 2021.**

### Reminder

**Wearing a mask is mandatory** in all indoors and outdoors public spaces. Anyone found not wearing a mask will have to pay a fine of up to **€100**.
