1- Innovation

Nairobi, Kenya (Innovation 1)

Challenge: improve urban refugees' access to UNHCR services at the BO Nairobi

Solutions: integrated system for two-way communication with refugees (SMS, Email, Interactive Voice Response, Scheduling system)

Current status: on hold due to the GOK's directive to implement encampment policy





Dadaab, Kenya (Innovation 2)

Challenge: ensure access to and quality education for refugees Nairobi

Solutions: ICT Innovations in Education by Microsoft and Safaricom

Current status: under implementation. In February 2013, vocational youth centers, primary, and secondary schools - 43 in total - received computers and training support



Dollo Ado, Ethiopia (Innovation 3)

Challenge: design rural village-like site plan for camp refugees

Solutions: hybrid site layout developed by UNHCR, NRC and ARRA

Current status: under implementation in Kobe camp as a pilot - 2 compounds of 13 shelters each





Dollo Ado, Ethiopia (Innovation 4)

Challenge: develop innovative solutions for hygiene and sanitation for camp refugees

Solutions: urine diversification latrines (UDDT) implemented by Oxfam GB

Current status: under implementation in Hilaweyn camp as pilot - 90 UDDT latrines





Global - Shelter (Innovation 5)

Challenge: provide refugees with a compelling alternative to emergency tents

Solutions: shelter prototype developed by Refugee Housing Unit

Current status: field test due to take place in Dollo Ado in April 2013 - 52 units





Global - Documentation (Inn. 6)

Challenge: improve collection of best practices

Solutions: Humanitarian Innovation Project by Oxford

Current status: under implementation - www.oxhip.org




Global - Idea Management (Inn. 7)

Current status: under development. Due to be deployed starting from April 2013 through 2015




Global - Core Relief Items (CRI) (Inn.8)

Solutions: portable bar-code reading device developed by UPS

Current status: under development

Simplification

- Policy coherence and better knowledge management

- Elimination or simplification of reports and reporting requirements
- Streamlined posting process (Compendia & Fast Track)

3 - Oversight

Progress on strengthening "Oversight"

- Establishment of an Independent Audit and Oversight Committee (IAOC)
- Creation of Internal Compliance and Accountability Committee (ICAC)
- Establishment of ERM system work in progress
- OIOS review of UNHCR evaluation capacity final draft received
- Appraisal of provision of internal audit services & development of business case
- Additional finance and project control positions
