

On 19 September, the United Nations General Assembly adopted the New York Declaration for Refugees and Migrants, which recognizes unprecedented levels of human mobility and aims to enhance the protection of refugees and migrants. The Declaration charts the way forward for refugee protection through a comprehensive refugee response (CRR) framework for large-scale refugee movements, including protracted situations, and will lead towards the adoption of a global compact on refugees in 2018. Panellists will be invited to share perspectives in this regard, as well as on wider developments with respect to the Declaration, including a proposed global compact on migrants.
