BACKGROUND PAPER

<u>Climate change – People on the move</u>

Tuesday 3 July 2012, 14h30 - 18h30 - Room 3

The session will be broadly divided into four parts:

Part 1 – Introduction:

Sensitization and awareness-raising: The participants will hear an overview of current knowledge about climate change and its impacts in relation to displacement.

Part 2 - Legal dimensions and gaps:

The participants will learn what is being done to fill the legal, knowledge and policy gaps in this area. This will include an introduction of Kälin and Schrepfer's report on cross-border displacement (listed below in reading materials), the pledges made by member states at the UNHCR ministerial conference in December 2011, and follow up being undertaken.

Part 3 - Sharing challenges and good practice:

The participants will learn about a new UNHCR-UNU study entitled *Climate change*, *vulnerability and human mobility: Perspectives of refugees from the East and Horn of Africa* and will be asked to speak of experiences at national level with populations displaced or at risk of displacement owing to natural disasters linked to climate change and the work of national actors.

Part 4 - Discussion on managing the negative environmental impacts of humanitarian operations

What can be done to limit the impact?

Part 5 - Summing up - Key messages:

Parts 1 and 2 of the session are geared towards information/education, whereas parts 3, 4 and 5 of the session are intended to encourage discussions on. The respective roles and responsibilities of local to international level actors, including displaced populations

themselves, authorities, civil society and UN actors should be drawn out in relation to each part.
