Policy Pledge Guidance

Higher Education Access and Finance

(Name of state) pledges to withdraw by (month and year) the following reservation/declaration made in (year of the reservation/declaration) to Article 22 of the 1951 Refugee Convention/1954 Statelessness Convention to allow (number of target population in the country) refugees and asylum-seekers/stateless persons to fully access post-secondary education for personal and professional development through earning tertiary education qualifications and to facilitate their transition to economic and social inclusion: (full text of reservation/declaration).

The Ministry of Higher Education is committed to fostering inclusivity and equitable access to education within our nation's borders. In alignment with this mission, we are dedicated to extending local student tuition rates to refugees, enabling them to pursue higher education opportunities on par with our citizens. Recognizing the potential that education holds in empowering individuals and contributing to societal development, we pledge to create a supportive framework that not only facilitates academic advancement but also nurtures an environment of understanding and collaboration among diverse student populations. Through this commitment, we aim to harness the talents and aspirations of refugees, enriching our educational landscape and reinforcing our nation's values of compassion and opportunity for all.

Recognition of Connected Higher Education Degree Programmes

(Name of state) pledges to adopt/amend law (name, code, year of the law if available) by (month and year) to recognize qualifications which have been obtained either partially or fully through online study which are granted by accredited institutions, and are up to and including Master's level (ISCED level 7). This policy aims to promote accessible and inclusive higher education opportunities for all citizens, including refugees and asylumseekers/stateless persons, to foster lifelong learning and flexible educational pathways, to



empower individuals to pursue higher education without geographical barriers and to promote digital literacy, innovation, and inclusive education in the digital age. The government encourages employers, professional associations, and other educational institutions to accept and value online university degrees on par with degrees taken through in-person study. It will collaborate with relevant stakeholders to ensure wider acceptance and understanding of the recognition policy.

Technical and Vocational Education and Training

Education Qualifications Recognition

Access to Labour Market
