





Global funding overview in 2024










Top Refugee Hosting Countries | 2024 Mid-year

Top ten donor share of voluntary contributions reduced from 77% in 2014 to 73% in 2024




Number of top donors (over USD20M) increased from 17 in 2014 to 23 in 2024




PSP contributions more than **tripled** from USD**208M** in 2014 to **630M** in 2024


