January - December 2024

The UNHCR Multi-Country Office in Panama provides support to refugees, asylum seekers, and other forcibly displaced people in eight countries: Aruba, Belize, Cuba, Curação, Guyana, Panama, Suriname and Trinidad & Tobago. These countries host over 200,000 forcibly displaced people.

UNHCR works in close collaboration with **Governments and partners**, responding to the protection, legal, and basic needs of forcibly displaced people, supporting host communities, thus helping forcibly displaced people find safety and rebuild their lives.

MAIN RESPONSE



People informed on protection rights, access to essential services, and sensitized on international protection.
