Top Refugee Hosting Countries | 2024 Global Trends

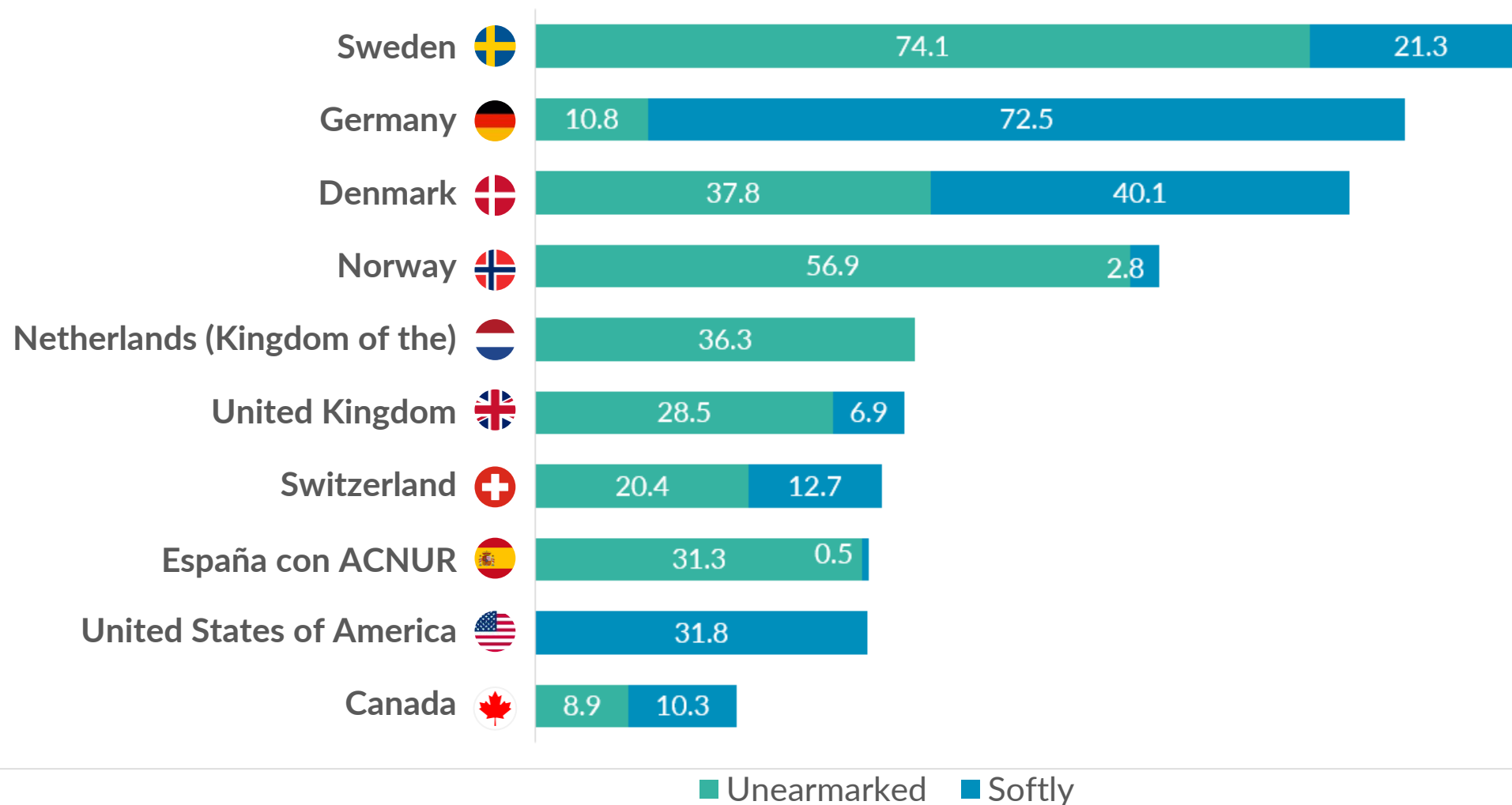

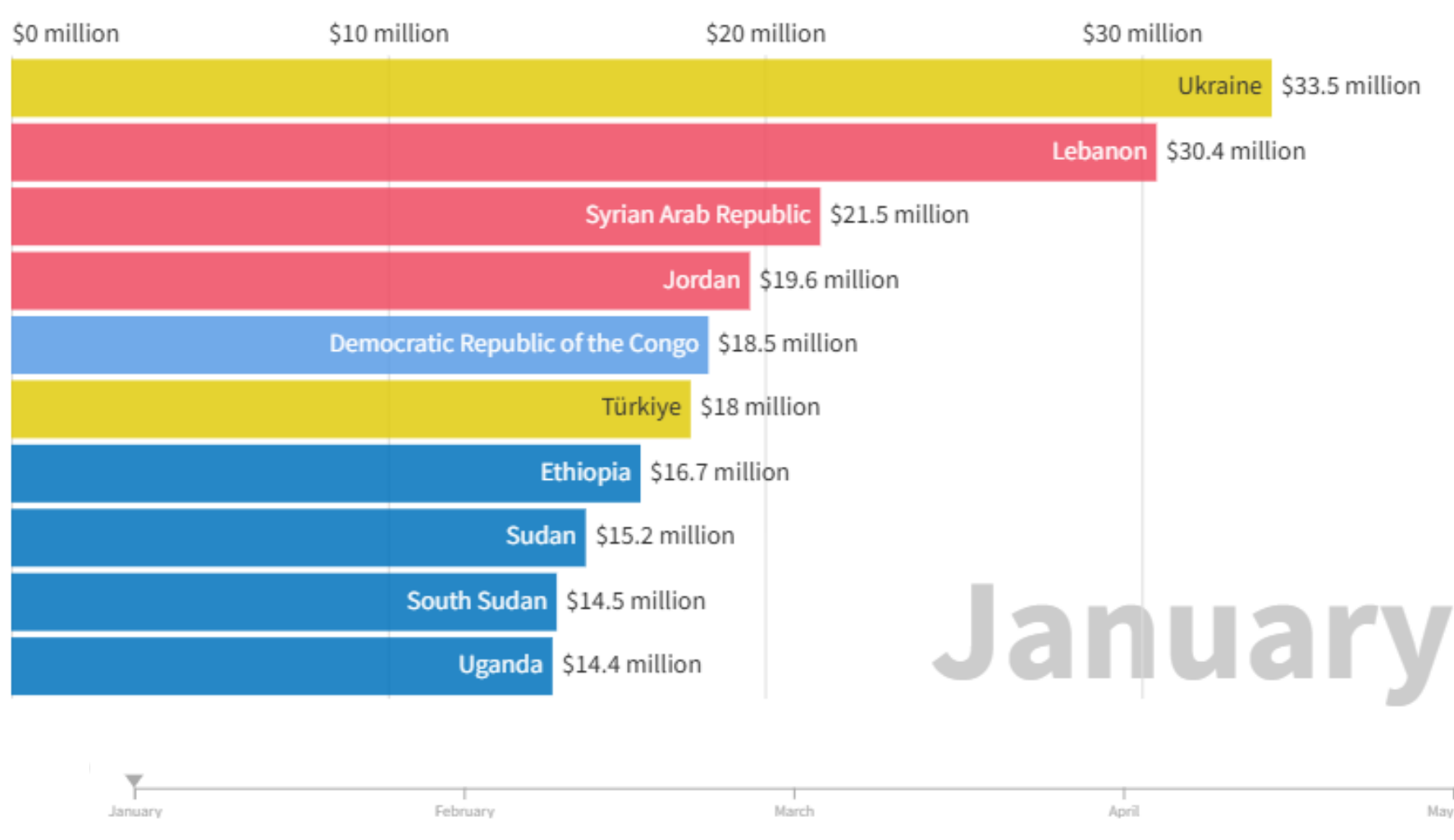

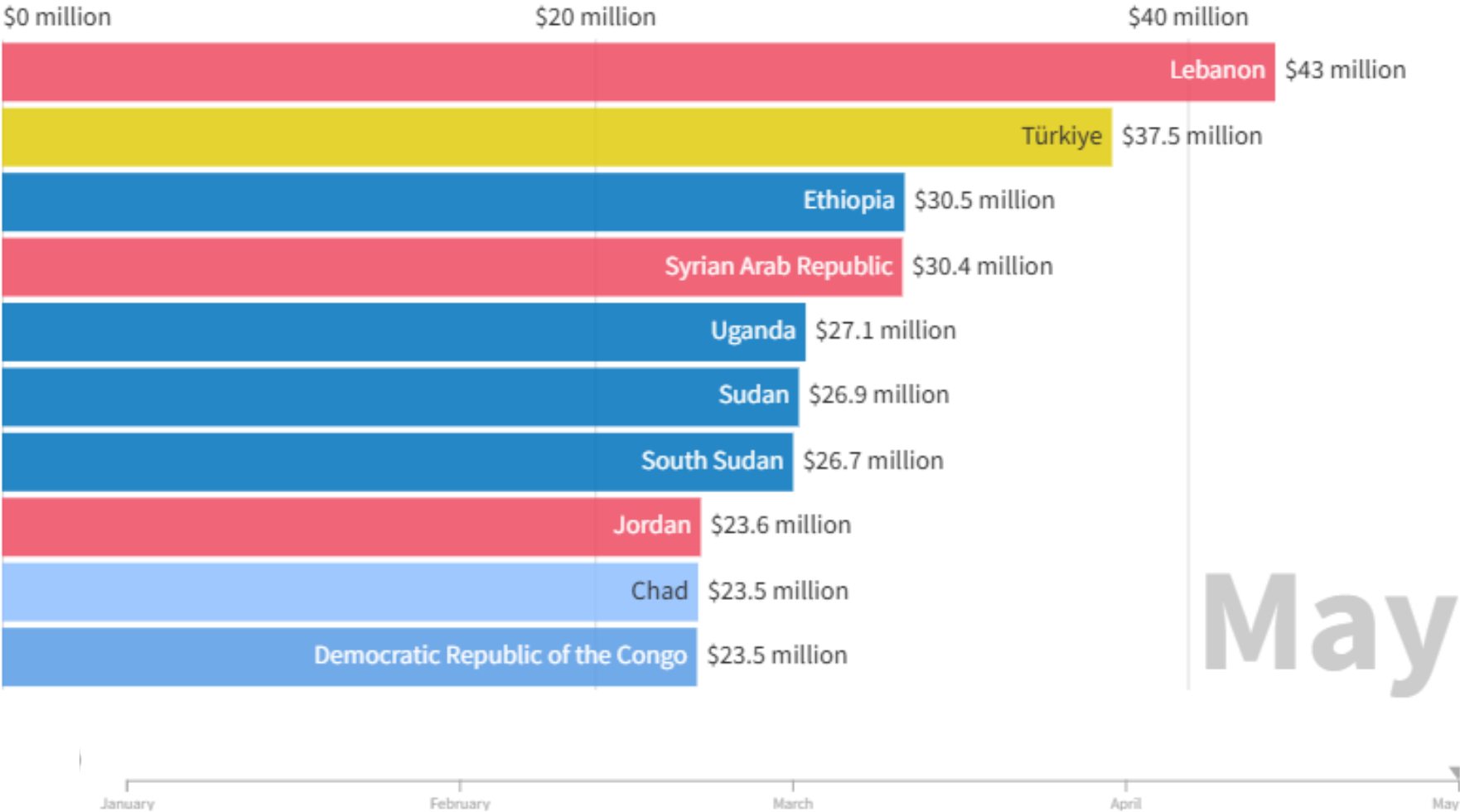


Indicative flexible funding allocations | 2025

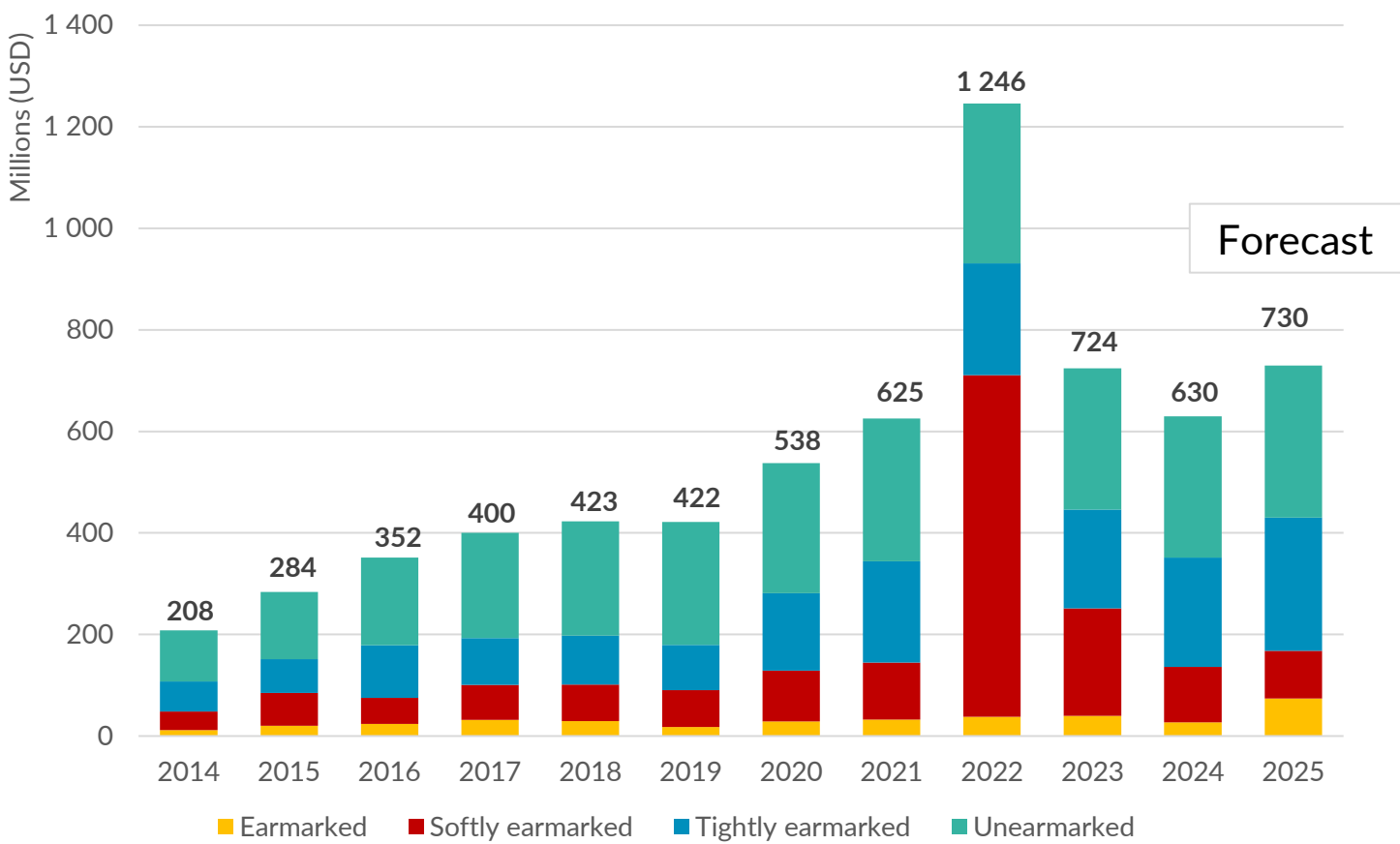

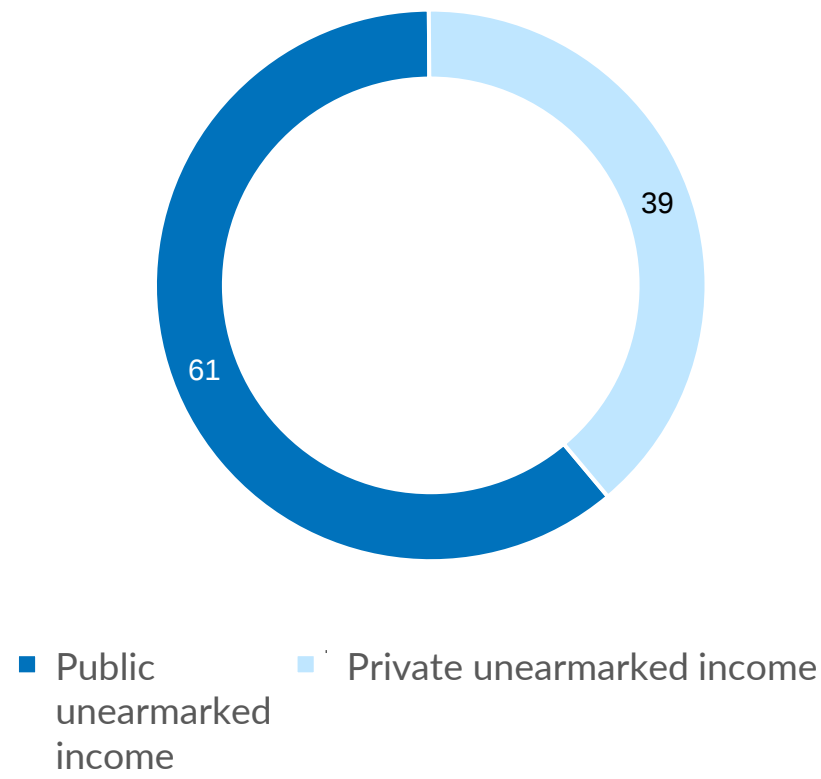

Projected unearmarked income: Public vs. Private







50% cut in financial aid, non-food items and shelter.



35% cut in health programmes.



34% cut in education programmes.



24% cut in operations responding to emergencies.



25% cut in registration and legal counseling activities.



23% cut in gender-based violence prevention & response.



7% cut in voluntary return activities.
