

Context

Since mid-February 2025, conflict in Nasir County, Upper Nile State, between the SSPDF and the White Army has led to large-scale displacement. Thousands of civilians, primarily women and children, have recently crossed into Ethiopia via the Burbiey entry point in Wanhoa District, Nuer Zone, Gambella Region following the conflict in South Sudan that started on 16 February. Thousands of people crossed the Baro river at Burbiey into Ethiopia, however, the fighting spread with shots fired across the river at civilian locations, causing both the arrivals and host community to flee further into Nuer Zone. They are now being hosted in the towns of Muon and Matar. RRS have agreed to begin L1 registration of the displaced population, and a new refugee site is being established at Luakdong.
