Highlights

UNHCR and humanitarian actors continue to assist earthquake affected communities remaining in need for assistance. With the recent heavy rains reported in different parts of the country, flooding impacted some earthquake affected areas, heightening some pre-existing vulnerabilities and adding another layer of challenges, particularly in shelter. Besides, flooding also disrupted access to roads and bridges, slowing down the provision of assistance where it is crucially needed.

To date, over 138,000 people have received assistance from UNHCR and partners. More than 192,000 people have been reached through protection monitoring and sectorial need assessments, which continue to guide targeted support for the most vulnerable, including those with specific needs, amidst new challenges induced by the current monsoon season.



UNHCR Response

- In Mandalay and Sagaing, UNHCR reached 96,911 people (21,431 families) to date, including 24,688 people (6,259 families) who received multi-purpose assistance.
- During the past two weeks, UNHCR continued to distribute core-relief items and emergency shelter supplies, including family tents to be used by affected communities, in Mandalay and surrounding areas. The team is also working with partners to assess community buildings renovation.
- In Nay Pyi Taw, UNHCR has assisted 9,843 people (2,092 families) to date. UNHCR and partners continue to assess the Non-Food Items and shelter needs, particularly for people facing vulnerabilities.
- In the South-East, 31,278 people (7,010 families) have received assistance to date, including 5,305 people (1,248 families) who received multipurpose assistance. Meanwhile, UNHCR and partners are planning the next round of NFI distribution for some 600 families in Bago-East and other parts of the region. The distribution has been delayed due to the recent flooding and is expected to take place later in August.
- Shelter needs assessments are also in progress in Bago-East to evaluate the most pressing shelter needs in light of the heavy rains affecting further vulnerable families.
- Due to heavy rain and related flooding reported in some of the earthquake affected areas, over 200,000 individuals have been displaced temporarily, while properties including houses, bridges, roads and farmlands have been severely damaged. UNHCR and partners are monitoring the situation to assess the most critical needs.

Immediate Needs

With support from donors, UNHCR continues providing life-saving assistance to those affected by the earthquake in Myanmar, but needs remain high, especially considering the current monsoon season. Provide emergency shelter kits (including plastic tarpaulin, ropes, and other essential materials) to enable people to live in safe and dignified shelters, particularly considering the monsoon season.



Deliver immediate emergency CRIs, including sleeping mats, blankets, kitchen sets, mosquito nets, buckets, and solar lamps, as well as multipurpose assistance to support earthquake-affected populations.



Strengthen access to protection services, including communication with communities, legal assistance, psychosocial support, and targeted interventions for Persons with Specific Needs, including children, women, Elderly People, and Persons with Disabilities.

Protection Mainstreaming

UNHCR continued to conduct protection monitoring and assessments to identify the needs of earthquake-affected communities and to inform response planning across several impacted areas.



Mandalay and Sagaing

UNHCR, in collaboration with civil society organization, continued to carry out a site visits to assess
locations for the installation of community tents aimed to serve as temporary learning spaces for
children supported by this partner.

Nay Pyi Taw

- UNHCR and partners conducted 10 Rapid Protection Assessments in Tract, Tatkon, Pyinama and Lewe Townships, reaching close to 20,000 earthquake-affected people (4,420 families, of which 1,370 families affected by the earthquake). Key findings indicated that shelter, multi-purpose assistance and psycho-social support remain critically needed.
- A partner organization provided 7 protection awareness sessions focusing Child Protection, Gender and Diversity (AGD), Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA) and UNHCR Hotline. The sessions reached a total of 240 individuals.
- A partner organization distributed protection-related Information, Education and Communication materials covering issues such as Child Protection, Civil Documentation, Gender-Based Violence, Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA), and promoting ways to access UNHCR Hotline in Bago East Region.

South-East

 Information, Education and Communication (IEC) materials including 100 pamphlets on Child Protection, Civil Documentation, PSEA, Gender-Based Violence (GBV) and UNHCR Helpline were distributed.

Coordination and Partnerships

For the earthquake response, UNHCR co-leads the Protection Cluster with the Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC) and jointly leads the Shelter/Non-Food Item (NFI) and Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM) Cluster with the International Federation of the Red Cross (IFRC).

Financial Information

UNHCR's total funding requirements for Myanmar in 2025 stand at USD 88.3 million. As of the end of June, only 32% of funding had been secured. UNHCR is grateful for the generosity of donors who have stepped forward with earmarked contributions for Myanmar, as well as those providing flexible funding globally ensuring life-saving assistance reaches those most in need.


