### **Update on budgets and funding (2025)**

### Summary

In October 2024, at its seventy-fifth plenary session, the Executive Committee of the High Commissioner's Programme approved the original annual budget of \$10,247.5 million for 2025. As of 30 April 2025, the current annual budget for 2025 stood at \$10,604.2 million, reflecting supplementary budgets of \$356.7 million that were established in support of the Middle East and Syria returns situations.

As of 31 July 2025, the cut-off date for this report, the total budget for 2025 remains the same at \$10,604.2 million.

A total of \$2,372.8 million was recorded in voluntary contributions for the budget year 2025 as of 31 July 2025.

A draft decision on budgets and funding for 2025 is provided in annex VIII.

#### I. Introduction

- 1. The present document provides an update on the UNHCR requirements and funding for 2024 as of 31 July 2025. It should be noted that all income and expenditure amounts are expressed on a modified cash basis.<sup>1</sup>
  - The original and current budget and interim expenditure for 2025 are summarized in annex I.
  - Annex II provides the lists of transfers from the 2025 operational reserve.
  - Annex III shows the supplementary budgets established for 2025.
  - Annex IV shows overall contributions to UNHCR for 2025.
  - Annex V shows contributions via national partners for 2025.
  - Annex VI provides the list of flexible contributions to UNHCR for 2025.
  - Annex VII provides the list of flexible contributions from private donors for 2025.
  - Annex VIII provides a draft decision on budgets and funding for 2025.

### II. Update on budgets and funding for 2025

#### A. Original and current budget

- 2. The original annual budget of \$10,247.5 million for 2025 was approved by the Executive Committee at its seventy-fifth plenary session in October 2024.<sup>2</sup>
- 3. As of 31 July 2025, the cut-off date for the data presented this report, supplementary budgets of \$356.7 million resulted in the current annual budget for 2025 of \$10,604.2 million.

#### B. Supplementary budgets

- 4. In June 2025, at the ninety-third meeting of the Standing Committee, a total budget of \$10,604.2 million was reported as at 30 April 2025, reflecting supplementary budgets of \$356.7 million in support of the Middle East and Syria returns situations, as reflected in table II.1 below. As of 31 July 2025, the sum of supplementary budgets is unchanged. A breakdown of 2025 supplementary budgets by situation, region and impact area is presented in annex III.
- 5. Since the beginning of 2025, UNHCR has responded to 22 emergencies in 16 countries, sometimes multiple emergencies in the same country. Regarding the Middle East situation UNHCR is providing protection and addressing urgent needs in Lebanon. In the Syrian Arab Republic, UNHCR is conducting robust protection monitoring for returnees, facilitating access to essential services for vulnerable persons, distributing non-food items, and providing legal aid, protection services and mental health and psychosocial support. The supplementary budgets have been mostly budgeted under impact area 2 (respond) and impact area 4 (solve).

Figures are presented in millions of United States dollars. The totals in this document may not add up due to rounding.

#### C. Transfers and other adjustments

- 6. In addition to the 2025 supplementary budgets, the current annual budget for 2025 incorporates transfers from the operational reserve, as well as other internal adjustments made by the High Commissioner, in accordance with financial rule 208.2.<sup>3</sup> As of 31 July 2025, there had been transfers of \$27.6 million from the operational reserve as presented in annex II.
- 7. Table II.2 compares requirements for 2025 by region, global programmes and headquarters from the end of April to the end of July 2025. As shown, there was no other internal adjustment in the operational requirements during this period.

8. Table II.3 presents the 2025 requirements by impact area. Increases were in impact area 2 (respond) and impact area 3 (empower), following budget reallocations driven by the needs in Ethiopia and the Sudan. In addition, there were modest decreases of 3 per cent in impact area 1 (protect) and 1 per cent in impact area 4 (solve). UNHCR continues to deliver core protection and support solutions, including through engagement with governments and development partners.

As of 31 July 2025, voluntary contributions of \$2,372.8 million were recorded for the budget year 2025, including \$347.7 million from non-governmental organizations, foundations and private donors. At this time last year, \$3,272.6 million had been received or pledged, including \$303.8 million from non-governmental organizations, foundations and private donors
- 11. In view of the demands placed on the Office, donors are encouraged to continue to respond generously to the High Commissioner's appeal for resources to meet the current annual budget requirements, including through unearmarked funds.

#### **Annex VIII**

### Draft decision on budgets and funding for 2025

The Standing Committee,

Recalling the Executive Committee's decision, at its seventy-fifth session on administrative, financial and programme matters (A/79/12/Add.1 para. 12 (b)), as well as discussions by the Standing Committee on the programme budgets and funding item at its ninety-third meeting in June 2025,

Reaffirming the importance of responsibility-sharing in solidarity with countries hosting refugees,

Takes note of the increase in UNHCR's annual budget for 2025 as at 31 July 2025 to a current total of \$10,604.2 million, representing the sum of the original budget of \$10,247.5 million and supplementary budgets of \$356.7 million;

Recognizes that emergencies and unforeseen activities unfolding in 2025 may result in the need for additional or expanded supplementary budgets and that additional resources, over and above those for existing budgets, would be needed to meet such needs; and

Urges Member States to continue to respond generously with flexible and unearmarked contributions, in the spirit of solidarity and in a timely manner, to the High Commissioner's appeal for resources to meet in full the annual budget for 2025.
