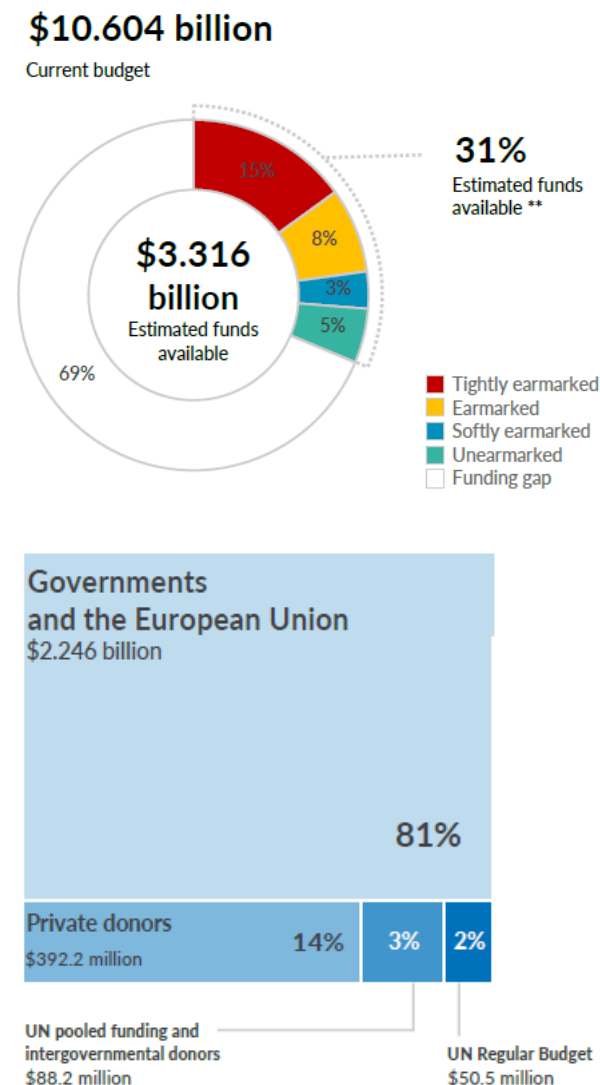
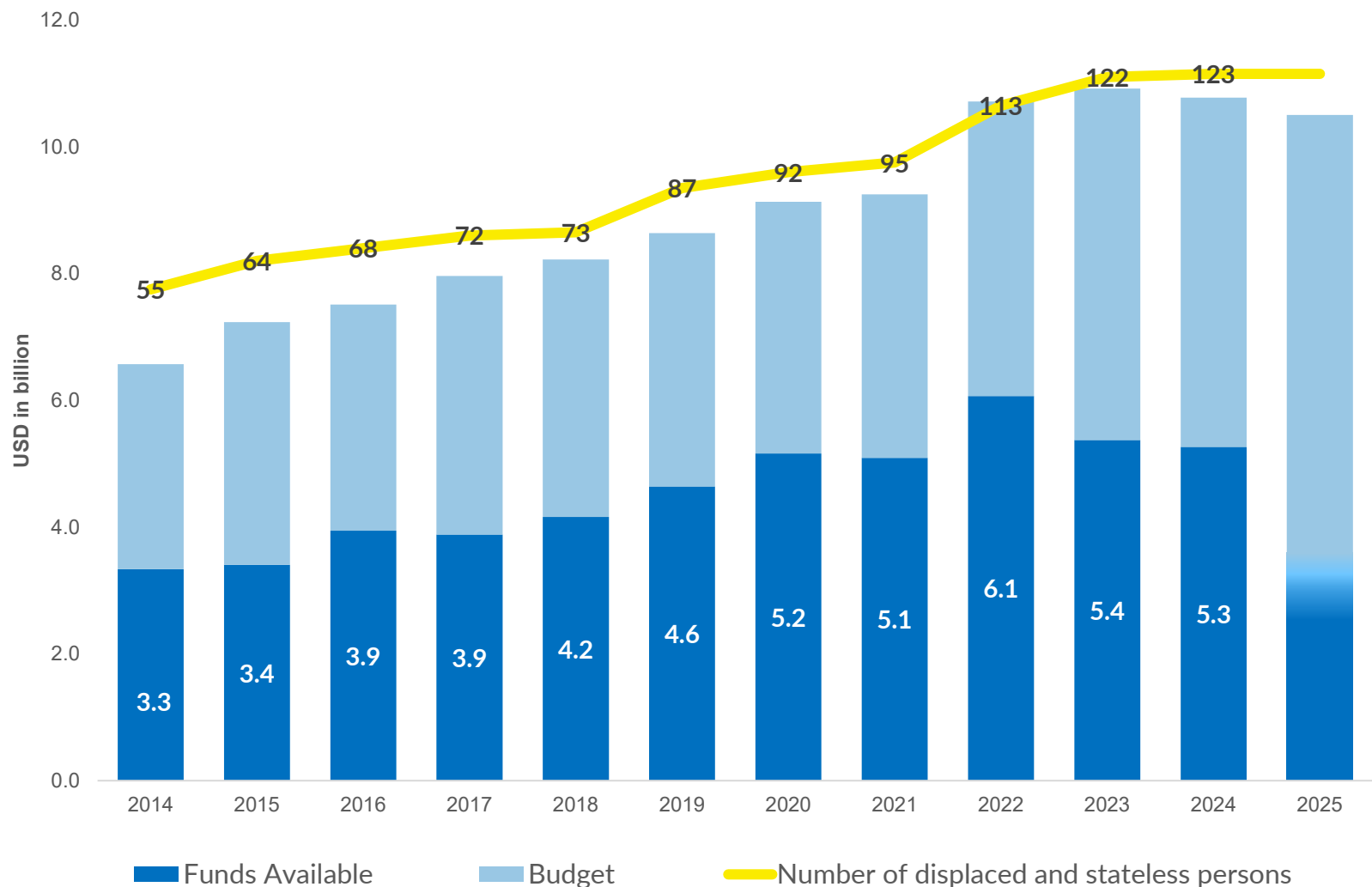

Global funding overview as of 31 August

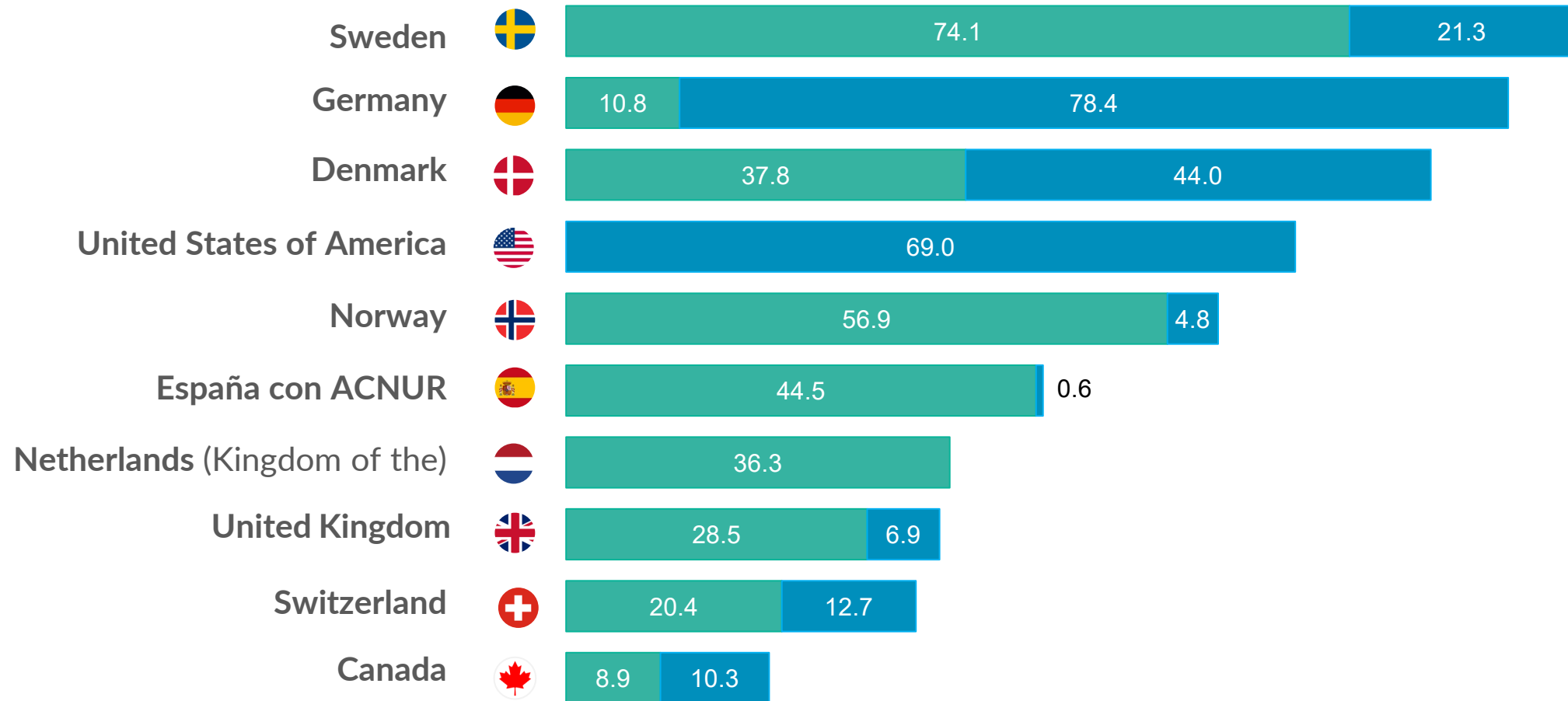

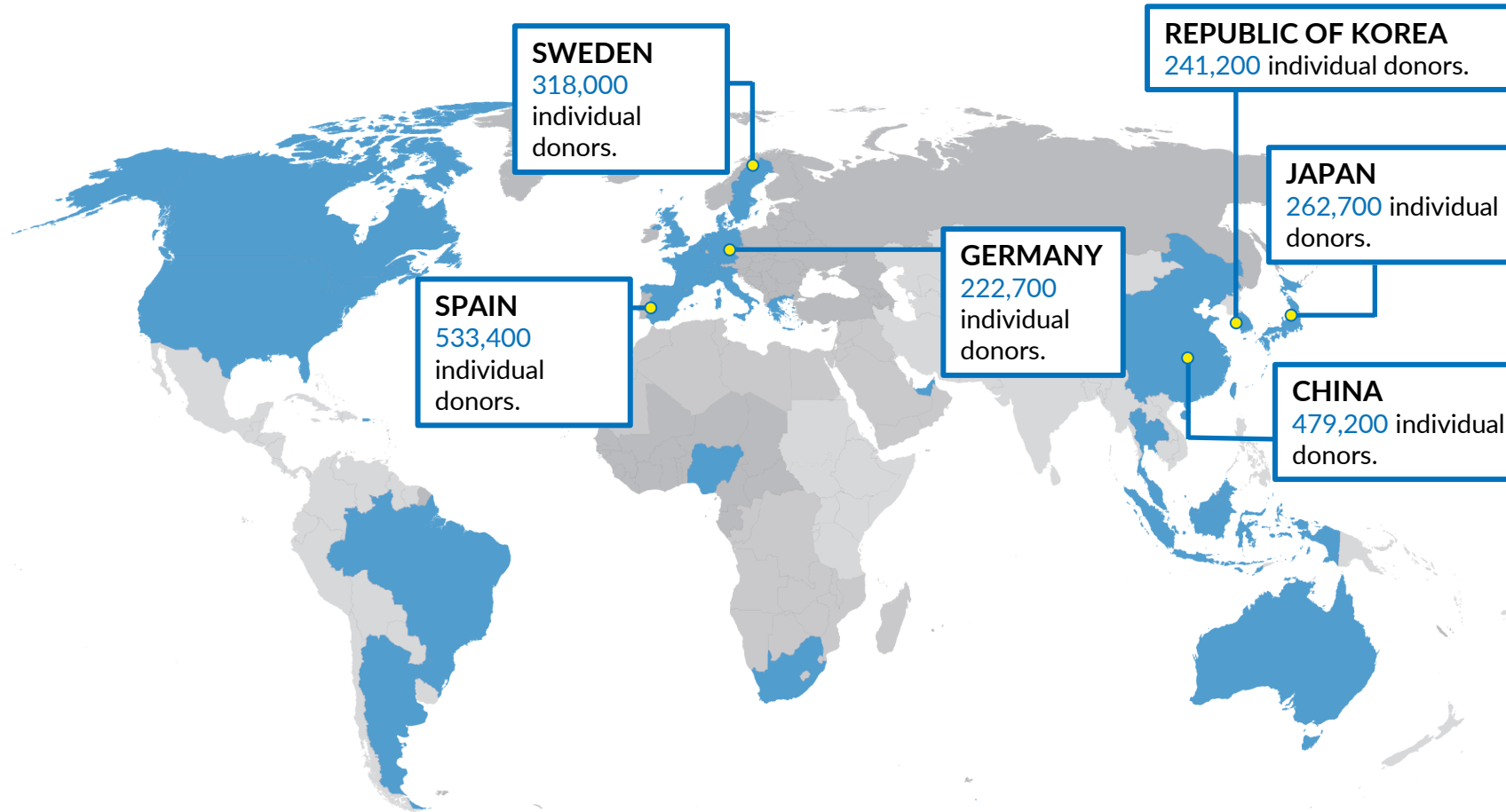

3.2 million individual donors across 28 countries.

90% of unearmarked income from the private sector.

\$26M increase from existing donor base (**14% increase**).

UGANDA

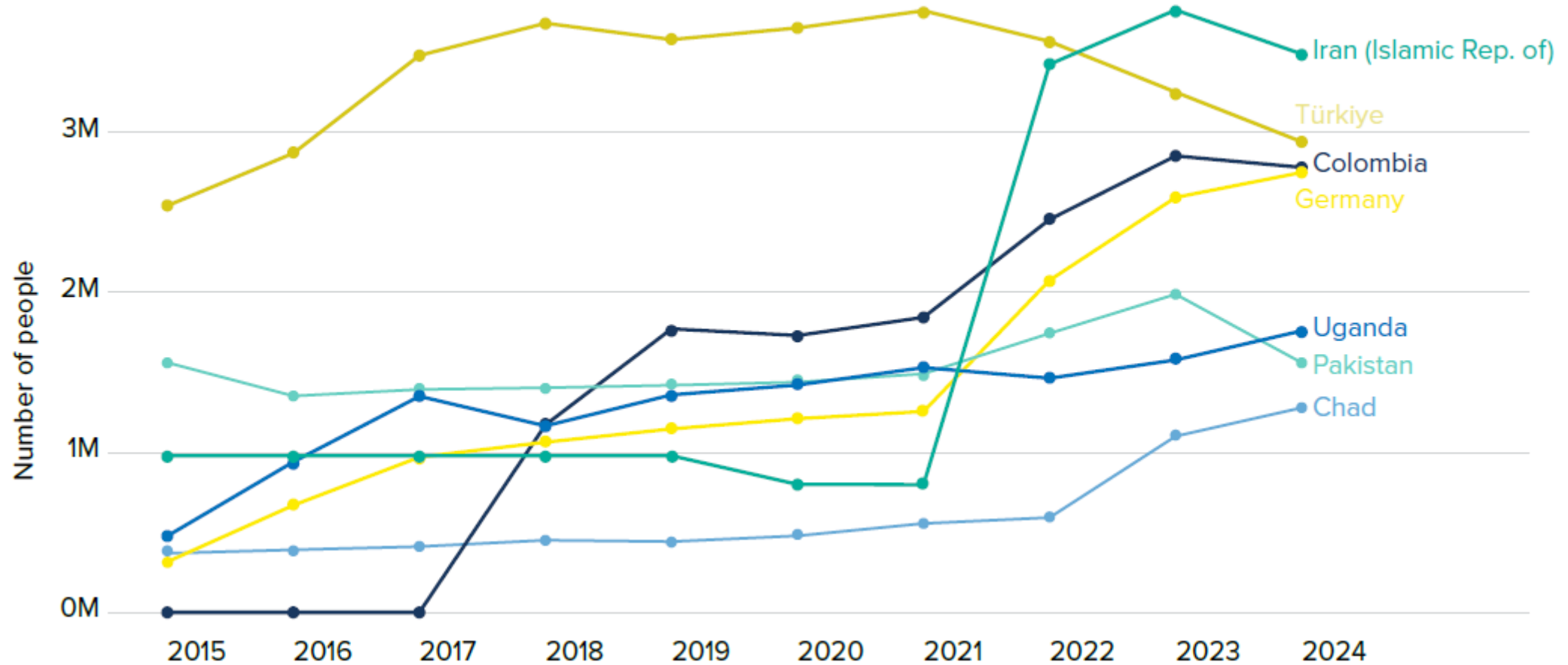

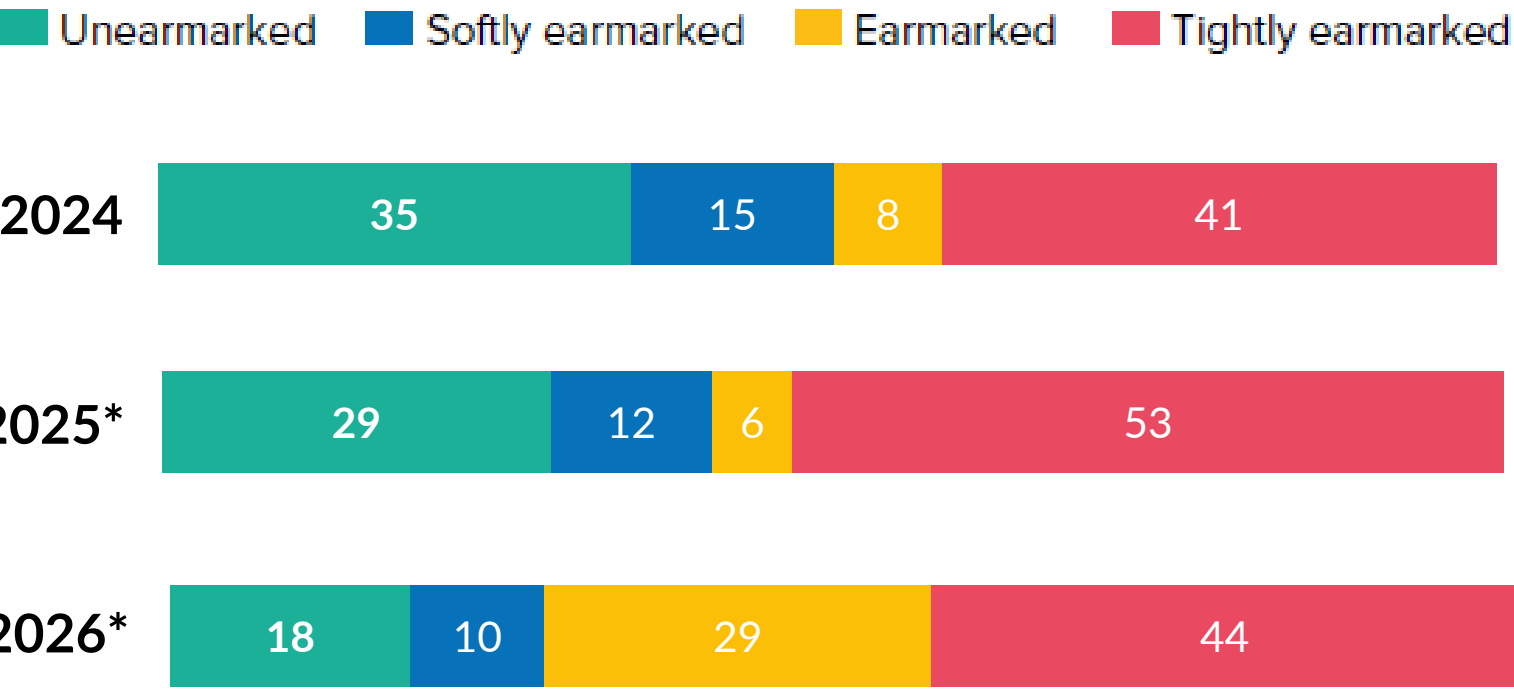
Top Refugee Hosting Countries | 2024 Global Trends
