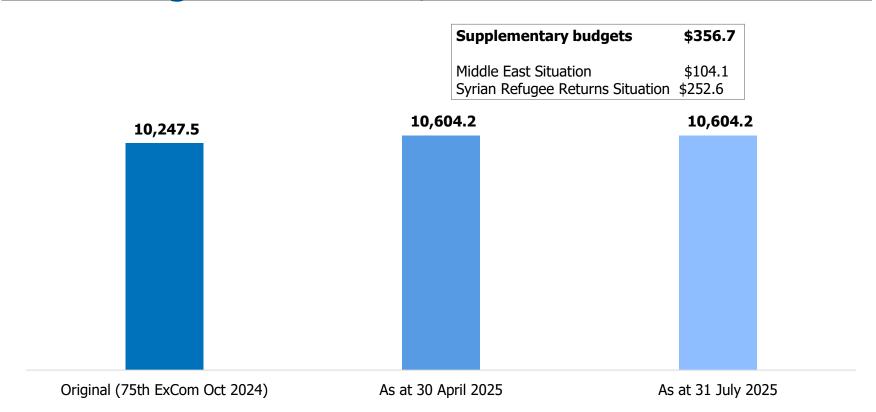

Refugees and Asylum seekers

- **•** 31 July 2024: \$ 2,270m; 80%
- 31 July 2025: \$ 1,916m; 81%

Returnees

- 31 July 2024: \$141m; 5%
 - 31 July 2025: \$162m; 7%

Increasing support to returnees

Expenditure by Regions - July 2024 - July 2025

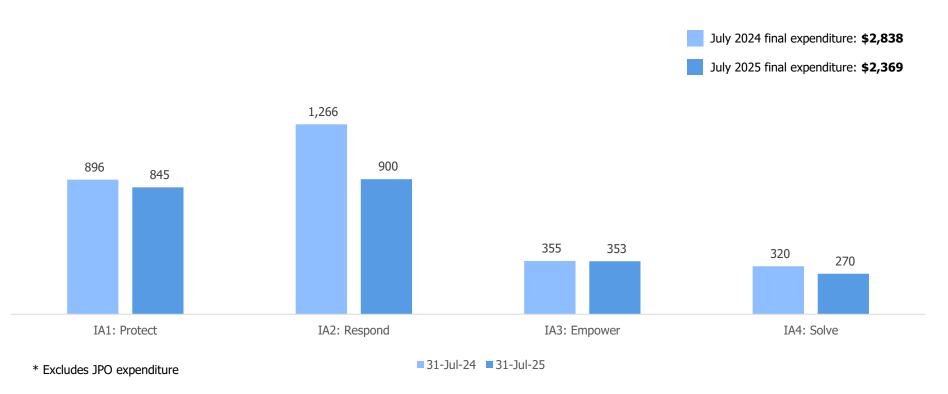
Expenditure decreased globally by **16.5%**, from USD **2.84 billion to 2.37 billion** compared to the previous year.

Regional expenditure reductions were significant in **Europe** (-26.3%), the **Middle East and North Africa** (-20.0%), and the **East and Horn of Africa and the Great Lakes** (-17.5%).



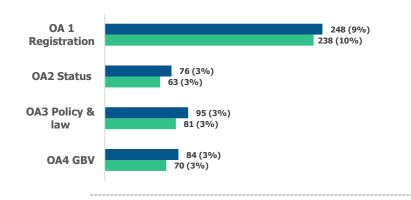


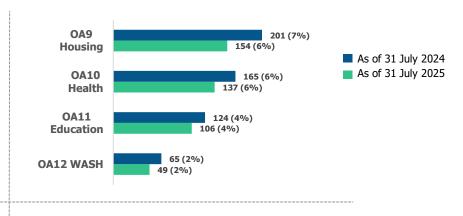
Expenditure by Impact Areas - July 2024 - July 2025

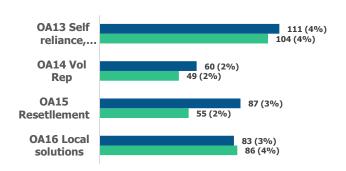


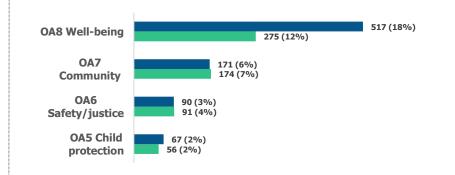


Expenditure by Outcome Areas – 2024-2025











Results achieved in 2025 (mid-year) compared with 2024 (mid-year)



- UNHCR has continued to prioritize solutions, including returns, self-reliance and inclusion activities
 - Counselling and information on voluntary repatriation reached 290,000 people (150,000 people in 2024).
 - Livelihoods reached 230,000 people (170,000 people in 2024).



UNHCR has continued to provide key services at similar levels to 2024

- Specialized GBV programmes supported 600,000 people (630,000 in 2024).
- **Shelter** was provided to 680,000 people (630,000 people in 2024).





Results achieved in 2025 (mid-year) compared with 2024 (mid-year)





- Nonetheless, with fewer resources, we are forced to reduce activities or levels of support in key areas that benefit those we serve
 - Registration of 2.13 million people (3.04 million people in 2024) with reduced expenditures in 2025 of \$238 million vs \$248 million in 2024.
 - Cash assistance received by 2.0 million people (2.16 million people in 2024, reaching people with smaller cash grants resulting in expenditures of \$275 million in 2025 vs \$517 million in 2024.
 - Health consultations provided to 6.04 million people (9.53 million 2024), reflecting decreased expenditures of \$137 million in 2025 compared to \$165 million in 2024.
