

Global timeline GRF Progress Review - 2025






Update on Pledge Implementation

- Strong engagement: Since October 2024, more than 1,400 individual updates were received
- Cumulatively, 3,453 pledges recorded:
 - 626 pledges have been fulfilled
 - 1,379 are in progress
 - 98 at the **planning** stage
- Bilateral outreach continues
- The <u>next pledge progress outreach</u> planned for October (reporting continuously open)

Non-Exhaustive Takeaways from Stocktaking (to-date)

- Inclusion in national systems (health/MHPSS, education, GBV, social protection, child protection) is advancing but still uneven → funding is a constraint.
- Economic inclusion is growing, yet legal/work barriers as well as issues related to access to finance persist.
- Asylum systems are modernizing through regional cooperation and digitization but need sustained support.
- Third-country solutions: progress on family reunification but risk reductions in 2025/26
- Advancing housing and property for returnees, and combatting misinformation, disinformation, hate speech, but picture is still incomplete on Obj. 4.
- Regional/Support platforms and pledges have been instrumental in advancing protection, inclusion, MRP (MIRPS, Chile Plan of Action, IGAD, SSAR, Rohingya)



Update on Pledge Matching

Matching has evolved → need to adopt a strategy which is fair, pragmatic, and driven by lessons learned

Key Elements of Revised Strategy – 3 Pillars

- 1. While still identifying core matches, **acknowledge existing contributions**, outside of GRF process
- 2. Enhance efforts towards **costed policy pledges and linkages to national development plans** → linkages to budget cycles and Sustainable Responses (SR)
- 3. Redouble efforts towards **broadening the base of support and financing** to ease pressures, including:
- **Innovative financing**, <u>not to substitute</u>, <u>but to complement</u> in easing pressures
- **Development cooperation** in terms of financing and instruments.

Proposed Next Steps:

- **Bi-annual pledge matching review exercise,** aligned to existing reporting process
- **Light-touch working group** on matching
- Proposal to convene dedicated consultation before GRF PR on matching



Global Refugee Forum Progress Review 2025 Overview

- **Dates:** 15-17 December 2025
- **Venue:** CICG, Geneva
- Participation: Senior officials of States and multistakeholder partners
- Programme: Dynamic mix of plenary sessions (opening/closing ceremonies, panels and spotlight sessions, discussion and multi-stakeholder pledge moments) and "ecosystem" beyond plenary
- Meaningful refugee participation will be a key feature throughout the programme


