Since 2015, Italy has been among UNHCR's top donors, consistently demonstrating its strong commitment to protecting and assisting forcibly displaced people around the world. This long-standing partnership is strengthened through regular high-level engagement, including an annual strategic dialogue focused on shared humanitarian priorities.

Aligned with the Mattei Plan, Italy's contributions have played a **crucial role in advancing UNHCR's programmes**—ranging from protection activities and efforts to prevent and respond to violence against women and children, to shelter, healthcare, and socio-economic inclusion initiatives.

Italy's dedication to pursuing **sustainable solutions** is reflected in its support for resettlement, humanitarian corridors, emergency evacuations, labour mobility pathways, and university corridor programmes.

In 2025, Italy's funding enabled UNHCR to respond to both new and protracted displacement crises in Chad, Egypt, Iraq, Lebanon, Libya, Niger, Sudan, Uganda, and other operational contexts.





## Government contributions in 2025 | USD



