# Information note concerning the MORE Project

### 1 Funding and coordination

The MORE Project is co-funded by the European Refugee Fund.

The Project Partners are the Ministry of Labour, Finland and the Reception and Integration Agency, Ireland. The Co-operating Organisations are the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), the European Council on Refugees and Exiles (ECRE) and the International Organisation for Migration (IOM).

### 2 Aim and Objectives of the Project

### Aim

The aim of the MORE Project is to develop comprehensive resettlement models which can be utilised by European Union Member States and other countries.

### **Objectives**

The overall objective of the project is to improve the integration of resettled refugees in terms of both the quality and speed of integration.

#### Additional objectives are:

- To collect and analyse examples of best practice in previous humanitarian evacuations;
- To facilitate mutual transnational learning and information sharing complemented by practical testing of tools and methods;
- To take account of the needs of the most vulnerable refugees in the development of the resettlement models.

### 3 Activities

National development tasks and training programmes for refugees and for service providers will be conducted in Finland and in Ireland. These activities will involve the testing of new tools and methods. Staff exchange programmes and fact finding missions will be conducted with a view to building capacity and progressing the project's research dimension. Mapping exercises - aimed at mapping current reception and integration practices in Finland and Ireland - will be conduced and the results published. Finally, in light of the outcomes of the project's activities, models for the resettlement process will be developed by the project partners and cooperating organisations.
