
Maps of International Migration in the Gulf of Aden Region


Map 1: International Migration in the Gulf of Aden




Map 2: Departure and arrival points in the Gulf of Aden Region

The term "East Africa Route" refers to those trajectories that lead from East Africa via Sudan, Chad and Libya to the Mediterranean Sea. The route has several branches, which are sometimes connected by the same hubs - strategic transit places along the migration routes that provide migrants with the necessary infrastructure and services to continue their migration journey. The main hubs on the route are Addis Ababa (as a gathering and starting point), El Gedaref, Kassala, Dongola and Selima in Sudan, as well as Kufra, Sebha and Al Jawf in Libya. Al Jawf is the nexus for two routes, one leading from Sudan and the other from Chad to the Libyan coast
