Update on budgets and funding in 2010 and projections for 2011

I. Introduction

1. UNHCR's revised Biennial Programme Budget for 2010-2011 was approved by the 61st session of the Executive Committee (A/AC.96/1087) in October 2010. Thus, this is the first biennium cycle of UNHCR's new budget structure. The annexes to the present document provide details and updated information on various aspects of budgets, expenditure and funding in 2010 and 2011, as well as a table showing UNHCR's major target beneficiaries. The final annex contains a draft decision on budgets and funding in 2011 which is being proposed for adoption by the Standing Committee.

II. Annual Budget expenditure and funding in 2010

- 2. At its sixtieth plenary session in October 2009, the Executive Committee approved programmed activities for the initial 2010-2011 Biennial Programme Budget amounting to \$2,778.5 million for 2010; an Operational Reserve (OR) of \$196.8 million; and \$20 million under the "New or additional activities mandate-related (NAM)" Reserve. The Executive Committee also took note of the \$12 million in budgeted activities for Junior Professional Officers (JPOs), bringing the initial budget requirements for 2010 to \$3,007.3 million (A/AC.96/1068).
- 3. At its sixty-first session in October 2010, the Executive Committee approved the 2010 revised Annual Budget amounting to \$3,288.7 million, comprising the initial budget requirements of \$3,007.3 and a total of \$281.4 million for nine supplementary budgets (A/AC.96/1095, para. 14).
- 4. As of December 2010, the revised Annual Budget for 2010 remained at the level approved at the sixty-first session of the Executive Committee, i.e. a total of \$3,288.7 million (Annex I-A, column 4). Total transfers from the 2010 Operational and NAM Reserves stood at \$78.4 million and \$17 million at the end of December, leaving a balance of \$118.4 million and \$3 million respectively under the Operational and NAM Reserves (Annexes II and III).
- 5. As summarized in Annex I-B, the Pillar distribution for the revised 2010 Annual Budget at December 2010 amounted to \$3,288.7 million, representing \$2,330.6 million for the Global Refugee Programme (Pillar I); \$21.8 million for the Global Stateless Programme (Pillar II); \$184.6 million for the Global Reintegration Projects (Pillar III); and \$751.7 million for the Global IDP Projects (Pillar IV).
- 6. The total expenditure in 2010 is estimated at \$1,848.6 million. With a carry-over from 2009 of \$202.4 million, and an amount of \$1,903.5 million in contributions (including \$39.6 million in contributions from the United Nations Regular Budget for management and administration costs, and \$12 million for JPOs), the total funds available as of 31 December 2010 stood at \$2,105.9 million. However, with adjustments of \$6.1 million, this amount is reduced to \$2,099.8 million. The total net income with adjustments amounted to \$1,897.4 million, representing 58 per cent of the comprehensive budget of \$3,288.7 million: this is an increase of 5.4 per cent above the income of \$1,799.5 million received in 2009, and 20.6 per cent more than the \$1,573.5 million of income received in 2008.
- 7. A summary of total expenditures and funds available for the revised 2010 Annual Budget is provided in Annex I-A. The final figures for expenditures and income, and respective breakdowns by Pillar, will be confirmed only at the time of issuance of the 2010 accounts (expected in the course of March 2011). Thus, all expenditure and income figures in this document are provisional.

8. With a favourable carry-over of an estimated \$251.2 million and continuing strong donor confidence, the High Commissioner is optimistic that the protection, assistance and solutions-oriented programmes for persons of concern to UNHCR will be sufficiently funded in 2011.

III. Annual Budget and funding projections for 2011

- 9. At its sixtieth session in October 2009, the Executive Committee also approved programmed activities for the 2011 Annual Budget of \$2,565.4 million (including provisions for management and administration costs covered by contributions from the United Nations Regular Budget, estimated at \$41.4 million). Together with an OR of \$182.6 million, a \$20 million provision for the NAM Reserve, and \$12 million in budgeted activities for JPOs, the total initial budget requirements amounted to \$2,780.0 million (A/AC.96/1068).
- 10. At its sixty-first session in October 2010 under the 2010-2011 Biennial Programme Budget, the Executive Committee approved the revised total budget requirements amounting to \$3,320.8 million for 2011. This revised budget comprises programmed activities of \$3,069.5 million (including provisions for management and administration costs covered by the UN Regular Budget contributions); an Operational Reserve of \$219.3 million;
- \$20 million for the "New or additional activities mandate-related" Reserve and \$12 million in budgeted activities for JPOs which remained unchanged. The revised total budget requirements by Pillar are shown in Annex VII-B.
- 11. As of 31 January 2011, four supplementary budgets had been approved, amounting to \$240.9 million to cover: the continuation of assistance to flood victims in Pakistan (\$65.6 million A/AC/96/1087/Add. 2 refers); the continuation of the programmes for IDPs in Kyrgyzstan (\$11.4 million); and emergency preparedness and response for the situations in the Sudan (\$120.1 million) and in Côte d'Ivoire (\$43.8 million). The 2011 Annual Budget was further revised to \$3,561.7 million by 31 January 2011. Details can be found in Annex VII-A.
- 12. As summarized in Annex VII-B, with the inclusion of these new supplementary budgets, the Pillar distribution for the revised 2011 Annual Budget stood at \$3,561.7 million, comprised of \$2,521.6 million for the Global Refugee Programme (Pillar I); \$62.8 million for the Global Stateless Programme (Pillar II); \$285.8 million for the Global Reintegration Projects (Pillar III); and \$691.5 million for the Global IDP Projects (Pillar IV).
- 13. Donor response at the December 2010 Pledging Conference confirmed a sustained commitment to supporting vital programmes of the Office throughout the year. However, UNHCR's current financial situation will still have to be closely monitored. Donors are therefore urged to respond generously to the High Commissioner's Appeal for resources to meet the revised 2011 Annual Budget.

Annex IX

Draft decision on budgets and funding in 2011

The Standing Committee,

Recalling the Executive Committee's decision at its sixty-first session on administrative, financial and programme matters (A/AC.96/1095, para. 14) as well as its discussions under the programme budgets and funding item at the 49th meeting of the Standing Committee,

Reaffirming the importance of international burden and responsibility sharing in reducing the burden of host countries, especially developing ones,

- 1. *Notes* that UNHCR's overall needs under its Annual Budget for 2011, based on currently known requirements, amount to \$3,561.7 million;
- 2. *Notes* that the 2011 supplementary budgets currently amount to \$240.9 million for programmes benefiting refugees and internally displaced persons;
- 3. Recognizes that emergencies and unforeseen activities unfolding during 2011 may result in the need for additional or expanded supplementary budgets and that additional resources, over and above those for existing budgets, would be required to meet such needs; and
- 4. *Urges* Member States, in light of the extensive needs to be addressed by the Office of the High Commissioner, to respond generously, in a spirit of solidarity, and in a timely manner, to his appeal for resources to meet the approved 2011 Annual Budget, as well as the requirements of the 2011 supplementary budgets.

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
