



- (2) People of concern to UNHCR not included in the previous columns but to whom UNHCR extends protection and/or assistance.
- (3) Democratic Republic of the Congo: The number of Rwandan refugees in the Democratic Republic of the Congo is subject to change based on a registration exercise carried out in 2014 that resulted in a figure of 243,000 identified Rwandans, as well as an ongoing biometric registration exercise.
- (4) Algeria: According to the Government of Algeria, there are an estimated 165,000 Sahrawi refugees in the Tindouf camps.
- (5) Jordan: The refugee population includes 29,300 Iraqis registered with UNHCR in Jordan. The Government estimates the number of Iraqis at 400,000 individuals at the end of March 2015. This includes refugees and other categories of Iraqis.

- (6) Bangladesh: The refugee population includes 200,000 people originating from Myanmar in a refugee-like situation. The Government of Bangladesh estimates the population to be between 300,000 and 500,000.
- (7) Myanmar: The figure for stateless people refers to people without citizenship in Rakhine State only and does not include an estimated 170,000 IDPs and people in an IDP-like situation who are included under the IDP population, but who are not considered nationals. The total stateless population in Rakhine State is estimated to be approximately 1 million.
- (8) China: The 300,000 Vietnamese refugees are well integrated and in practice receive protection from the Government of China.
