## **Actualisation des budgets et du financement pour 2016 et 2017**

*Résumé*

Le budget annuel final pour 2016 s'est élevé à 7 509,7 millions de dollars E.-U., ce qui représente une augmentation de 963,4 millions de dollars E.-U. par rapport au budget annuel initial de 6 546,3 millions de dollars E.-U., approuvé par le Comité exécutif à sa soixante-sixième session en octobre 2015, une augmentation de 325 millions de dollars E.-U. par rapport au budget annuel révisé de 7 184,7 millions de dollars E.-U., approuvé par le Comité exécutif à sa soixante-septième session en octobre 2016.

Le total des fonds disponibles en 2016 est estimé à 4 435,6 millions de dollars E.-U., tandis que les dépenses pour la même année se chiffrent à 3 967,1 millions de dollars E.-U. Ces chiffres sont provisoires, car les comptes n'ont pas encore été définitivement clôturés. Le déficit financier, estimé en comparant le budget final basé sur l'évaluation des besoins au plan mondial à l'estimation des fonds disponibles, est de 3 074,1 millions de dollars E.-U., soit de 40,9 %.

Le budget annuel initial pour 2017, approuvé par le Comité exécutif à sa soixante-sixième session en octobre 2015, était de 6 408,5 millions de dollars E.-U. À sa soixante-septième session en octobre 2016, le Comité exécutif a approuvé un budget révisé de 7 309,7 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2017. Au 31 janvier 2017, le budget total s'élevait à 7 450,6 millions de dollars E.-U., reflétant l'ajout de deux budgets supplémentaires s'élevant au total à 319,2 millions de dollars, et une réduction de 178,4 millions de dollars E.-U.

Un projet de décision sur les budgets et le financement pour 2016 et 2017 figure en annexe IX.

## I. Introduction

1. Le présent document fournit à titre préliminaire des informations sur les performances financières en 2016. La clôture finale des comptes n'ayant pas encore eu lieu, les chiffres de 2016 sont provisoires au 31 janvier 2017<sup>1</sup>. Le document fournit également un aperçu des besoins estimatifs pour 2017 au 31 janvier 2017.

- Le budget annuel de 2016, les dépenses provisoires et les fonds disponibles en 2016 sont résumés en annexe I.
- Les annexes II et III fournissent la liste des prélèvements de la Réserve des opérations en 2016 et de la Réserve au titre des « activités nouvelles ou additionnelles – liées au mandat » pour la même période.
- L'annexe IV montre la répartition par situation des budgets supplémentaires établis pendant l'exercice budgétaire de 2016.
- L'annexe V montre l'ensemble des contributions reçues et enregistrées pour l'exercice clos le 31 décembre 2016.
- L'annexe VI présente la répartition par pays des contributions des organisations non gouvernementales, des fondations et des donateurs privés.
- L'annexe VII montre le budget annuel de 2017 au 31 janvier 2017.
- L'annexe VIII montre les toutes dernières statistiques disponibles pour les populations relevant de la compétence du HCR.
- En annexe IX figure le projet de décision sur les budgets et le financement pour 2016 et 2017.

2. Les chiffres définitifs du budget annuel et des dépenses pour 2016, qui seront confirmées à la suite de la clôture des comptes le 31 mars 2017, seront communiquées à la soixante-neuvième réunion du Comité permanent en juin 2017.

## II. Budgets et financement pour 2016

### *Total des besoins*

3. À sa soixante-sixième session en octobre 2015, le Comité exécutif a approuvé le budget annuel initial pour 2016 de 6 546,3 millions de dollars E.-U.<sup>2</sup>. À sa soixante-septième session en octobre 2016, il a approuvé le budget annuel révisé de 7 184,7 millions de dollars E.-U.<sup>3</sup>, qui tenait compte des besoins additionnels jusqu'au 30 juin 2016. Le budget annuel final de 7 509,7 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2016 représente la somme du budget initial approuvé de 6 546,3 millions de dollars E.-U. et du total des besoins additionnels identifiés pendant l'année (neuf budgets supplémentaires s'élevant au total à 1 006,8 millions de dollars E.-U.), et une réduction budgétaire de 43,4 millions de dollars E.-U.

*Budgets supplémentaires*

4. À la soixante-septième réunion du Comité permanent en septembre 2016, le HCR a annoncé que sept budgets supplémentaires avaient été établis, s'élevant à 826,3 millions de dollars E.-U. au 30 juillet 2016. Par la suite, l'un des budgets supplémentaires existants, pour la situation au Soudan du Sud, a augmenté de 37,5 millions de dollars E.-U., tandis que deux nouveaux budgets supplémentaires ont été établis, s'élevant au total à 143 millions de dollars E.-U. (130,5 millions de dollars E.-U. pour le rapatriement d'Afghans du Pakistan et 11,5 millions de dollars E.-U. pour la situation au Nigéria). L'ensemble des besoins au titre des budgets supplémentaires en 2016 se chiffrait à 1 006,8 millions de dollars E.-U. La répartition détaillée des budgets supplémentaires pour 2016, par activité, région et sous-région et par pilier figure en annexe IV. Un aperçu des budgets supplémentaires par situation figure également au tableau II.1 ci-dessous.

5. Une réduction budgétaire totale de 43,4 millions de dollars a été appliquée, comprenant 38,4 millions de dollars E.-U. pour la région Afrique, en raison de la révision des chiffres de population pour le Tchad, et 5 millions de dollars E.-U. pour la région du Moyen-Orient et d'Afrique du Nord du fait de l'alignement avec le Plan régional réfugiés et résilience en réponse à la crise syrienne.

*Répartition par pilier*

6. Les détails sur le budget annuel de 2016 sont fournis en annexe I. Le résumé de la répartition par pilier figure au tableau II.2 ci-dessous.

7. Le budget annuel final pour 2016 de 7 509,7 millions de dollars E.-U. comprend les activités programmées de 7 092 millions de dollars E.-U. (y compris les provisions pour les dépenses administratives au Siège couvertes en partie par la contribution du Budget ordinaire des Nations Unies) ; une Réserve des opérations de 385,7 millions de dollars E.-U. et la Réserve au titre des « activités nouvelles ou additionnelles – liées au mandat » de 20 millions de dollars E.-U. ; et 12 millions de dollars E.-U. pour le Programme des administrateurs auxiliaires. De plus amples informations sont fournies dans l'annexe I, tableau A.

8. Le total des fonds disponibles pour l'exercice clos le 31 décembre 2016 est estimé à 4 435,6 millions de dollars E.-U. Ce chiffre comprend 411,9 millions de dollars E.-U. de report de l'exercice de 2015 ; 3 902,3 millions de dollars E.-U. de contributions volontaires reçues ou promises ; 40 millions de dollars E.-U. du budget ordinaire des Nations Unies ; et d'autres revenus et ajustements actuellement estimés à 80,5 millions de dollars E.-U. Par rapport aux 3 706,8 millions de dollars E.-U. enregistrés en 2015, les fonds disponibles ont augmenté en 2016 d'environ 728,8 millions de dollars E.-U., soit de 19,7 %.

9. Par rapport aux fonds disponibles, le total des besoins estimés dans le budget annuel final de 2016 montre un déficit financier de 3 074,1 millions de dollars E.-U., soit de 40,9 %.

10. Avant la clôture des comptes, les dépenses pour 2016 sont provisoirement estimées à 3 967,1 millions de dollars E.-U. Par rapport aux 3 294,8 millions de dollars E.-U. de dépenses enregistrées en 2015, les dépenses ont augmenté en 2016 d'environ 672,3 millions de dollars E.-U., soit de 20,4 %.

11. Le report à 2017 est estimé à environ 468,5 millions de dollars E.-U., chiffre qui tient compte des fonds déjà affectés pour des opérations spécifiques devant être exécutées en 2017.

12. L'analyse financière provisoire pour 2016, faite ci-dessus, est résumée au tableau II.3 ci-dessous.

### **III. Aperçu pour 2017**

*Total des besoins*

13. Le budget annuel initial pour 2017, approuvé par le Comité exécutif à sa soixante-sixième session en octobre 2015, s'élevait à 6 408,5 millions de dollars E.-U. À sa soixante-septième session en octobre 2016, le Comité exécutif a approuvé, compte tenu de la mise à jour des besoins évalués, un budget révisé de 7 309,7 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2017. Au 31 janvier 2017, deux budgets supplémentaires s'élevant au total à 319,2 millions de dollars ont été établis, et une réduction budgétaire de 170,4 millions de dollars E.-U. a été appliquée, ce qui a permis d'avoir un budget total actuel pour 2017 de 7 450,6 millions de dollars E.-U.

*Budgets supplémentaires*

14. Les deux budgets supplémentaires susmentionnés ont été établis conformément à l'article 7.5 du Règlement de gestion du HCR. Le montant total de 319,2 millions de dollars E.-U. comprend 40,8 millions de dollars E.-U. pour la situation au Nigéria et 278,4 millions de dollars E.-U. pour la situation au Soudan du Sud, comme présenté au tableau III.1 ci-dessous.

15. La réduction budgétaire pour 2017 de 278,4 millions de dollars E.-U. pour la situation syrienne a été effectuée à l'issue de profondes consultations interinstitutions dans tout le pays, organisées dans le cadre de la finalisation du Plan régional réfugiés et résilience.

17. La réponse des donateurs au Comité ad hoc de l'Assemblée générale pour l'annonce de contributions volontaires au Programme du Haut Commissaire (Conférence d'annonces de contributions), tenu en décembre 2016, a confirmé l'engagement soutenu des donateurs de soutenir les programmes vitaux du HCR. Même si les montants annoncés ne couvrent pas tous les besoins évalués de 2017, ils donnent à l'Organisation une précieuse indication sur les financements prévus, permettant ainsi une saine planification financière et la poursuite des opérations sans interruption. Les donateurs sont encouragés à continuer de répondre généreusement à l'appel du Haut Commissaire pour des ressources en vue de satisfaire les besoins de 2017.

*Réaffirmant* l'importance du partage des responsabilités, en solidarité avec les pays accueillant les réfugiés,

1. *Rappelle* qu'à sa soixante-sixième session, le Comité exécutif a approuvé les programmes et les budgets initiaux pour les programmes régionaux, les programmes globaux et le Siège dans le cadre du Budget-programme biennal 2016-2017 du HCR, s'élevant à 6 546,3 millions de dollars E.-U. et à 6 408,5 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2016 et 2017 respectivement ;

2. *Rappelle* qu'à sa soixante-septième session, le Comité exécutif a approuvé la version révisée des programmes et des budgets pour les programmes régionaux, les programmes globaux et le Siège dans le cadre du Budget-programme biennal 2016-2017 du HCR (révisé) s'élevant à 7 184,7 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2016 et à 7 309,7 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2017 ;

3. *Note* que les budgets supplémentaires de 2016 s'élevaient à 1 006,8 millions de dollars E.-U. pour les programmes globaux en faveur des réfugiés, les projets de réintégration et les projets en faveur des déplacés internes ;

4. *Note* la réduction budgétaire de 43,4 millions de dollars E.-U. en 2016 ;

5. *Prend acte* de l'augmentation du budget annuel de 2016 du HCR, dont le total définitif s'élève à 7 509,7 millions de dollars E.-U., représentant la somme du budget initial de 6 546,3 millions de dollars E.-U. et du total des budgets supplémentaires de 1 006,8 millions de dollars E.-U., et une réduction budgétaire de 43,4 millions de dollars E.-U. ;

6. *Note* que les budgets supplémentaires de 2017 s'élèvent actuellement à 319,2 millions de dollars E.-U. pour les programmes globaux en faveur des réfugiés, les projets de réintégration et les projets en faveur des déplacés internes ;

8. *Prend note* de l'augmentation du budget annuel de 2017 du HCR, dont le total s'élève actuellement à 7 450,6 millions de dollars E.-U. au 31 janvier 2017, représentant la somme du budget révisé de 7 309,7 millions de dollars E.-U. et des budgets supplémentaires de 319,2 millions de dollars E.-U., et une réduction budgétaire de 178,4 millions de dollars E.-U. ;

9. *Considère* qu'en cas de situations d'urgence et d'activités imprévues en 2017, les budgets supplémentaires pourraient être complétés ou élargis, et que des ressources additionnelles, en sus de celles des budgets existants, pourraient être nécessaires pour répondre aux nouveaux besoins ;

10. Exhorte les États membres à continuer de répondre généreusement, dans un esprit de solidarité et en temps voulu, à l'appel du Haut Commissaire pour des ressources en vue d'exécuter pleinement le budget annuel de 2017.
