On 26 October 2017, five States in Central America and Mexico adopted the San Pedro Sula Declaration and agreed on a Comprehensive Regional Protection and Solutions Framework (MIRPS for its Spanish acronym). The MIRPS fosters regional cooperation between countries of origin, transit and destination with a view to addressing the root causes of displacement and sharing the responsibility to protect and find solutions for asylum-seekers, refugees, internally displaced persons, deportees with protection needs, as well as the populations affected by violence and insecurity. The MIRPS envisages a truly comprehensive approach led by the States, with the support of regional and international organizations and 10 cooperating States and entities.

During this event, a number of key stakeholders will present the early achievements of the MIRPS, as well as outline the challenges and needs going forward.
