Promoting access to labour mobility opportunities for refugees can lead to significant gains. Remittances can be an important source of revenue for their families, and help improve their self-reliance and build community networks in both countries of origin and asylum. By maintaining their independence and retaining and developing their skills, refugees become more resilient and are better able to overcome future challenges than when relying on humanitarian assistance over a prolonged period. Refugees contribute to local economies and are better prepared for solutions when they can seize such opportunities. Lastly, companies can improve their competitiveness by sourcing required skills from a larger pool, and economies can benefit from skills transfer and innovation.
