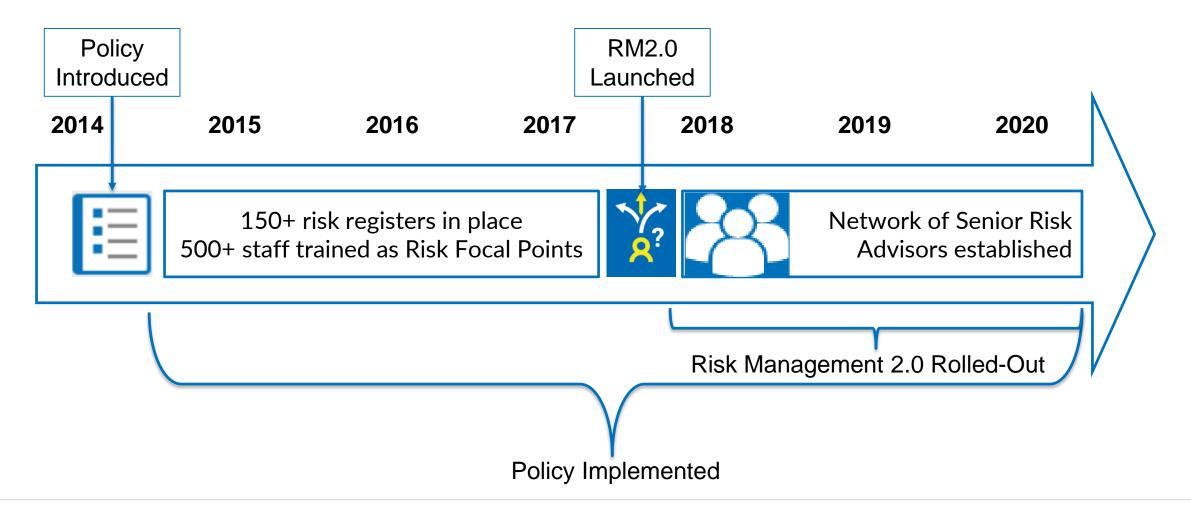

Assessment of UNHCR risk maturity

- April 2019: HLCM endorsed a Reference Maturity Model for Risk Management in the UN System
- August–September 2019: independent maturity assessment against the HLCM model in UNHCR
- Initial results:
 - 'UNHCR has an overall well established ERM system'
 - 'The overall recommendation is to continue the sound course set by RM 2.0'
 - 'Opportunities for further improvements exist'

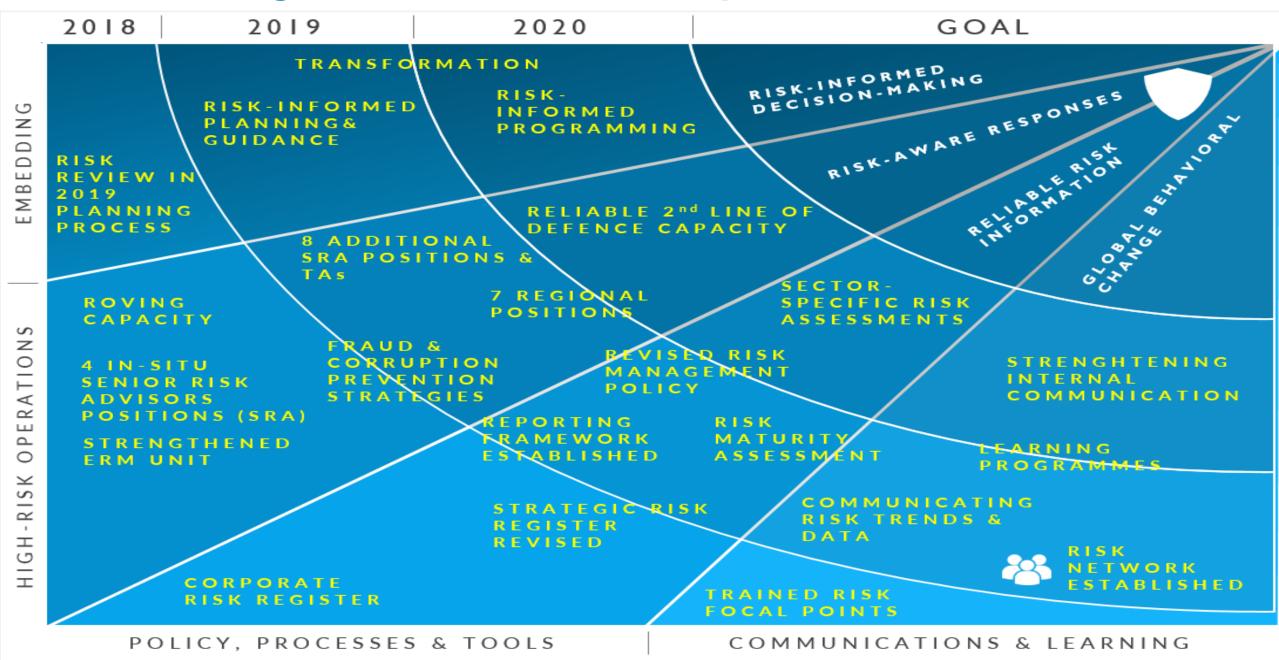
