The Grand Bargain Progress towards implementing the commitments

Summary for the 76th Standing Committee



Implementation by Workstream





Commitment achieved: UNHCR began publishing data in accordance with the International Aid Transparency Initiative (IATI) standards in September 2018.

Further improvement: the publication process is now automated, improving data quality, with the publication of full data on 2018 expenditure made in June 2019.



Commitment: to transfer 25%+ of program expenditures to local and national responders by the end of 2021.

Achievement: UNHCR moved closer to its target by transferring **21.4%** of its annual programme expenditure (\$ 3.453 billion) **to local responders**.

New policy: A policy adopted 1 June 2019 redefines UNHCR's contributions towards partner integrity capacity and support costs. The changes comprise a contribution of 4% for national partner programme support costs, and greater discretion in the way in which partners make use of this additional resource.





Commitment: Double the amount of funds programmed for cash based interventions as a proportion of the overall assistance.

> Achievement: UNHCR has delivered \$2bn since 2016 - \$568m in 2018. Cash assistance has nearly **doubled** from the 2015 baseline and exceeds in-kind assistance and services.



D. Reduce duplication and management costs with periodic functional reviews



Commitment: expand the **use of biometrics** for refugee registration to a total of 75 country operations by 2020.



Achievement: 62 country operations are using biometric refugee registrations. Beyond its use in registration, the use of biometrics ensures that rightful food beneficiaries have equitable access to assistance.



E. Improve joint and impartial needs assessments



Commitment: coordinated **joint needs assessments** and continue sharing **evidence-based needs assessment data**.

Achievement: UNHCR participated in at least 128 joint multi-sectoral assessments – 46% of these UNHCR led/co-led. UNHCR a leading agency for the Humanitarian Data Exchange, uploading over 1500 datasets in 2018.



Commitment: Ensure equal (50%) and meaningful participation of women and girls in all decision-making processes in forced displacement contexts.

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Updated Age, Gender and Diversity policy: mandates the establishment and promotion of feedback and response systems, including for confidential complaints across all UNHCR operations.



G. Increase collaborative humanitarian multi-year planning and funding



Commitment: pursue institutional changes to facilitate **multi-year protection and solutions strategies**, and programming in partnership with humanitarian and development actors.



Achievements:


- Multi-year multi-partner strategies: 22 developed.
- Multi year agreements: UNHCR has enabled operations to sign multi-year agreements with partners; there are 10 such agreements signed for 5 operations.



H. Reduce the earmarking of donor contributions

Commitment: increase the visibility of **unearmarked and softly earmarked funding.**

Results:




Commitment: Harmonize and simplify **reporting requirements** by end 2018.



- Common narrative template: '8+3' adopted by UNHCR.
- Global Focus: invested in Global Focus website <u>http://reporting.unhcr.org/</u> that exhibits donor funding, to coincide with the 2018 Global Report.

Commitment: cooperation with **multilateral development banks** to facilitate their engagement in forced displacement and support efforts that enable economic participation of the forcibly displaced.

Achievements:

- World Bank: Close collaboration providing strategic and technical support to International Development Association requirements and on the Global Compact for Refugees.
- **Others:** UNHCR-UNDP partnership on **rule of law** projects in 20+ countries.
- **NGOs:** Together with the World Bank, UNHCR facilitated the establishment of a Poverty Alleviation Coalition <u>https://alleviate-poverty.org/</u> working with 11 NGOs to apply the "graduation approach".
