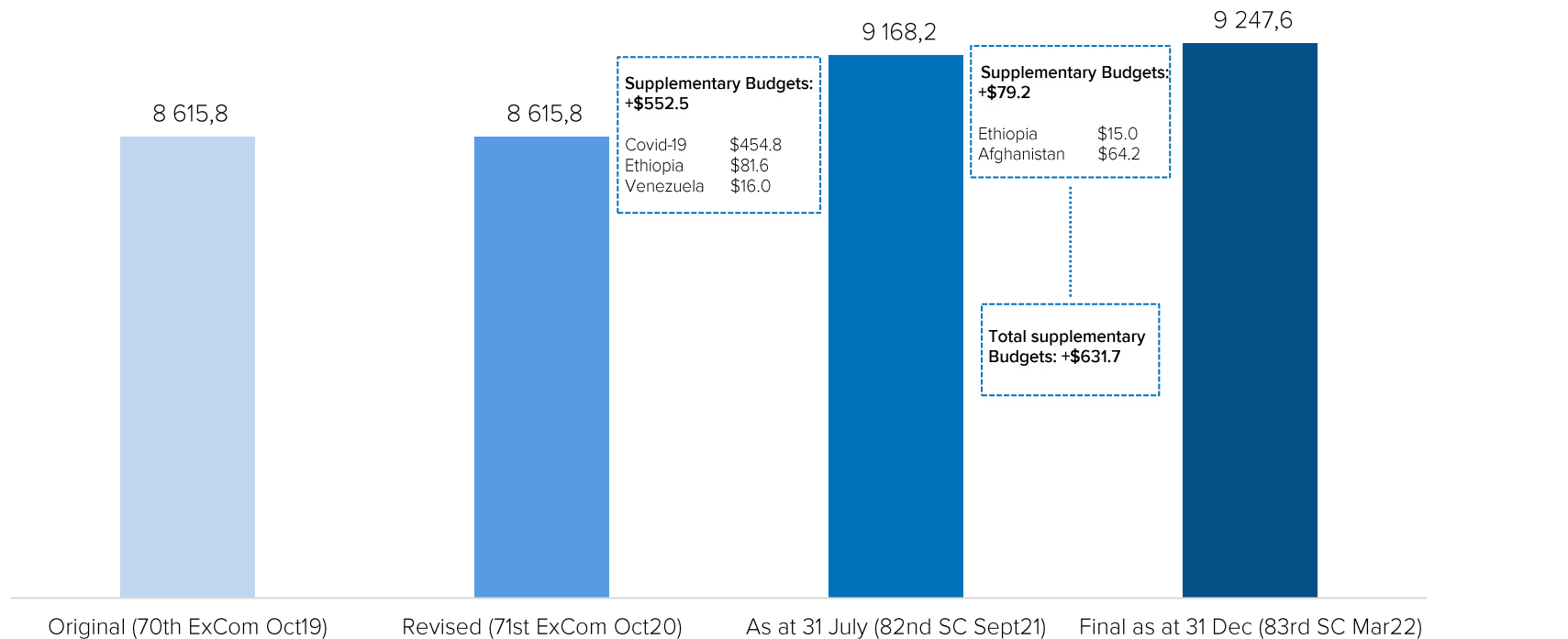

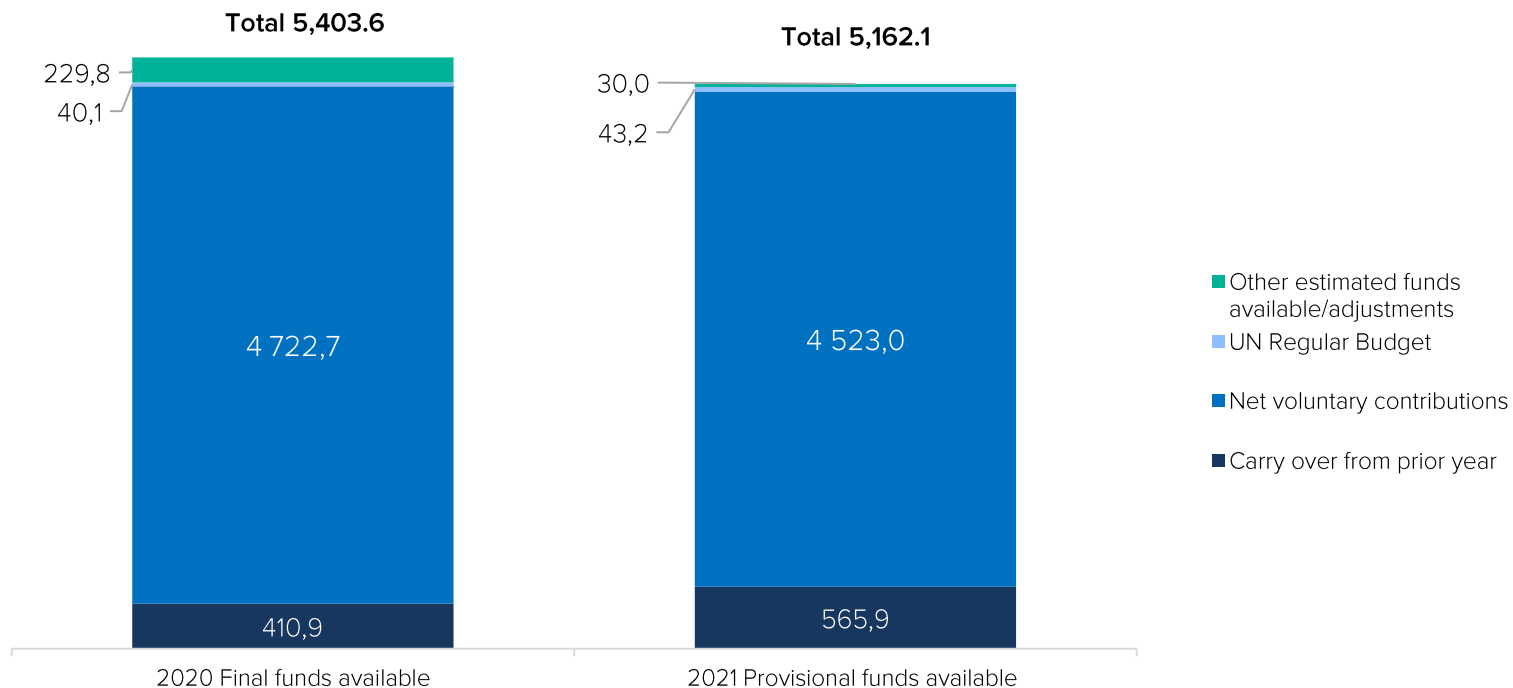
# 2021 Budget

# 2021 final budget reached \$9.2 billion



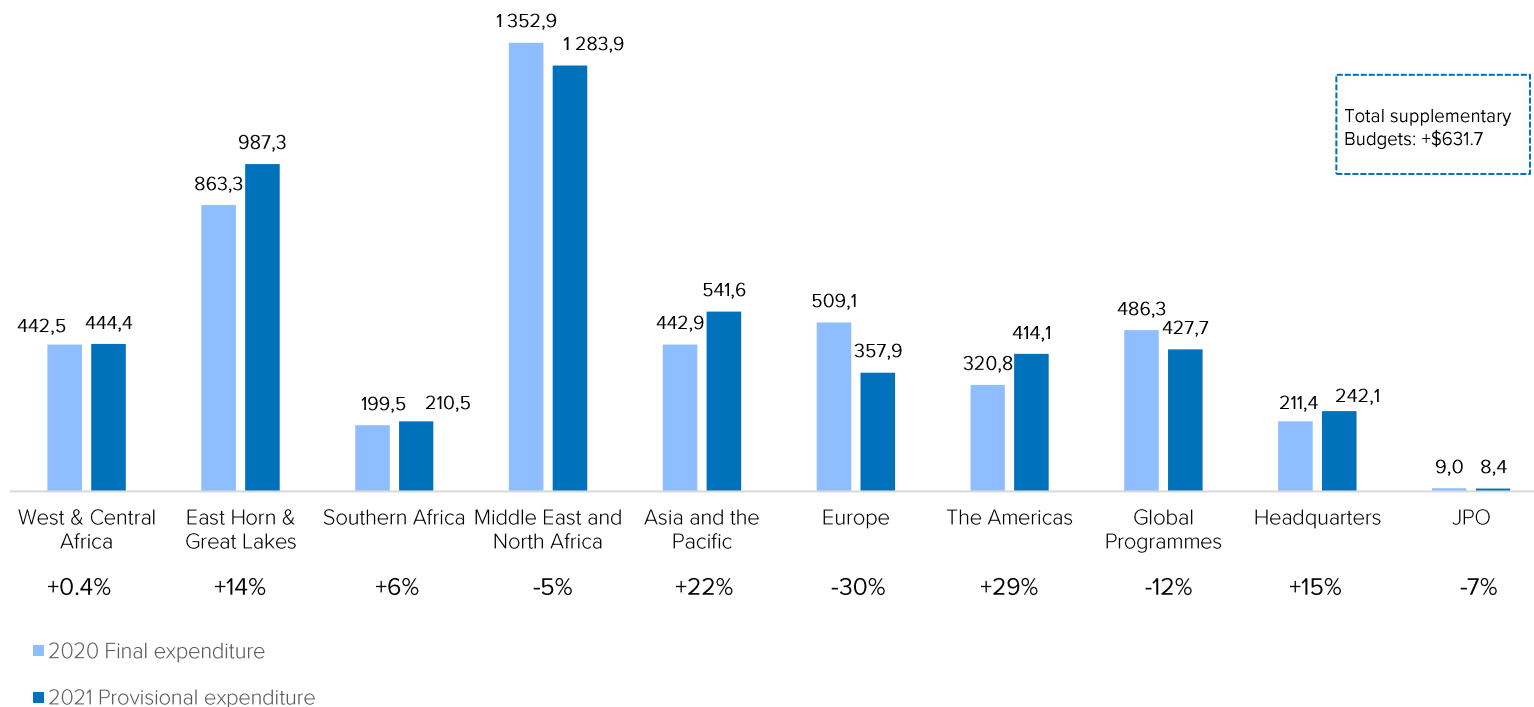
In US\$ millions

# Total funds available decreased by \$241.4 million in 2021



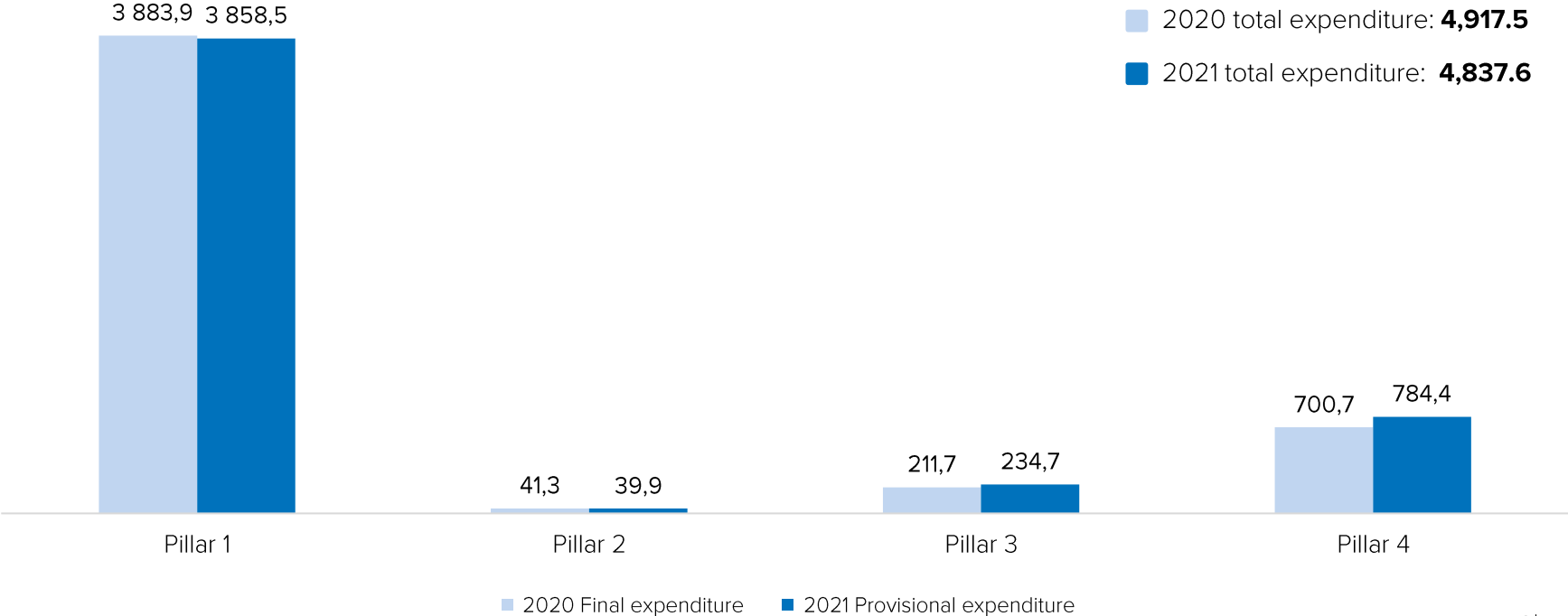

# Expenditure increases in Pillar 3 and 4

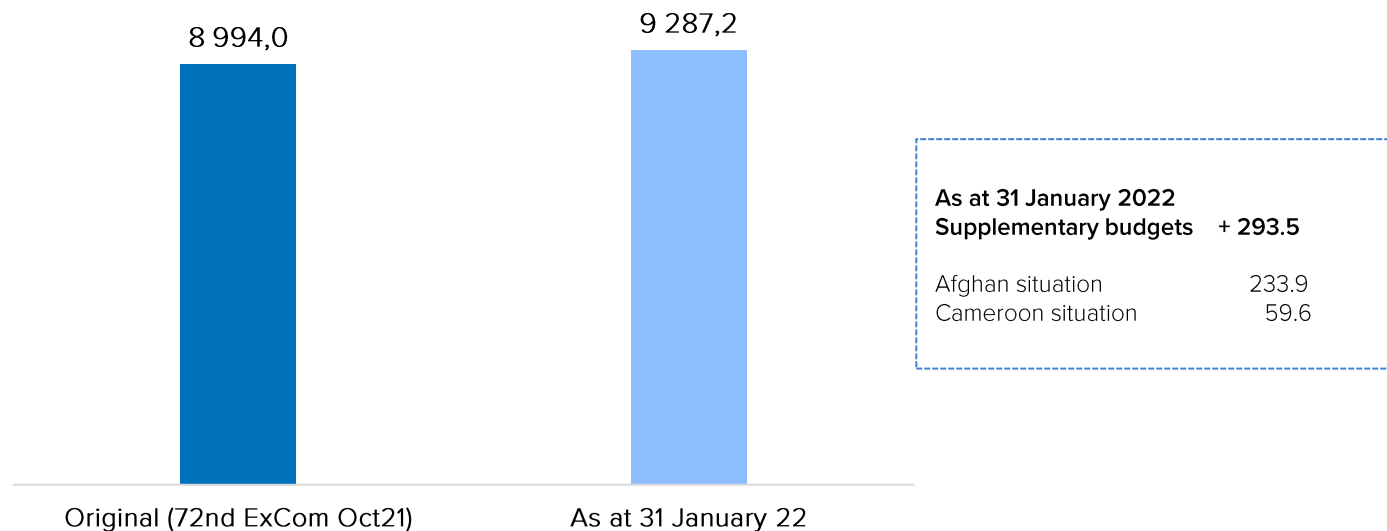

# Update on Afghanistan situation

Since the beginning of 2022:



**174,460 newly arriving Afghans** to neighboring countries



**More than half** of the population is dependent on life-saving and essential humanitarian assistance

UNHCR is providing **protection & emergency assistance**

In Afghanistan



**119,000** persons supported



**23 out of 34** provinces reached



**57,000** people benefited from cash for winterization

In the region



Leading inter-agency regional refugee response



Stepped-up support of host governments

# Update on Cameroon situation



**100,000 people displaced** in Cameroon & to neighboring Chad



**92% of adult IDPs** without civil documentation



**97%** without a birth certificate

Funding remains **critically low**

## UNHCR has stepped up its response

### In Cameroon



Scale up of protection & assistance, esp. civil documentation, CCCM, shelter, WASH, Health, and CRI distributions

### In Chad



**6,691** refugees registered \*



**8,622** individuals relocated to two new sites



**~2600** refugees vaccinated

# Update on Ukraine situation

As of 8 March:



**Over 2 million people displaced** to neighboring countries



**4 million people** may flee Ukraine in the coming weeks & months

SB: \$ 510 M

Pillar 1 \$ 240 M; Pillar 4 \$ 270 M

## UNHCR is **scaling up protection & assistance** in Ukraine & region

### In Ukraine



Together with partners, providing humanitarian assistance to IDPs (CRIs, shelter) legal counseling



Pre-positioned stockpiles for when safe passage allows

### In the region



Coordinating refugee response with other UN & NGO partners, in support of national authorities
