## Update on budgets and funding (2022 and 2023)

## Summary

In October 2021, at its seventy-second plenary session, the Executive Committee approved an original annual budget of $\$ 8,993.7$ million for 2022.

In 2022, four supplementary budgets amounting to a combined total of $\$ 1,720.3$ million were established in support of the Afghanistan, Cameroon, Pakistan and Ukraine situations. They bring the total final budget for 2022 to $\$ 10,714.0$ million as of 31 December 2022.
The original budget for 2023 as approved by the Executive Committee at its seventy-third plenary session in October 2022 amounted to $\$ 10,211.3$ million. Two supplementary budgets have since been established for the total amount of $\$ 305.8$ million in support of the Pakistan and Ukraine situations. The budget for the Iraq operation was reduced by $\$ 100.0$ million in order to align the operational footprint of UNHCR with the United Nations transition strategy in the country. The total current budget for 2023 stands at $\$ 10,417.1$ million.
Pending the annual closure of the accounts for 2022, the provisional total funds available for 2022 amounted to $\$ 6,130.6$ million, while provisional expenditure stands at $\$ 5,599.3$ million. When comparing the final annual budget for 2022 to the provisional amount of funds available, the funding gap amounts to $\$ 4,583.4$ million, or 42.8 per cent.

A draft decision on budgets and funding for 2022 and 2023 is provided in annex IX.

## I. Introduction

1. This document provides a preliminary update on the 2022 budget. ${ }^{1}$ As the closure of accounts had not yet been completed at the time of writing, all year-end figures for 2022 are provisional. This document also provides an overview of the estimated budget requirements for 2023 as of 31 January 2023.

- The original and final annual budget and provisional expenditure for 2022 are summarized in annex I.
- Annex II(a) and II(b) show transfers from the operational reserve for 2022 and 2023.
- Annexes III(a) and III(b) provide an overview of the supplementary budgets by situation, region and impact areas for 2022 and 2023.
- Annex IV shows overall contributions recorded for 2022.
- Annex V gives a breakdown by country of 2022 contributions from non-governmental organizations, foundations, and private donors.
- Annex VI provides the list of unearmarked and softly earmarked voluntary contributions in 2022.
- Annex VII shows the original and current annual budgets for 2023 as of 31 January 2023.
- Annex VIII shows the latest provisional (mid-2022) statistics on persons of concern to UNHCR by country/territory of asylum.
- Annex IX provides the draft decision on budgets and funding for 2022 and 2023.

2. The final annual budget, funding, and expenditure figures for 2022, which will be available following the closure of accounts on 31 March 2023, will be reported at the eightyseventh meeting of the Standing Committee in June 2023.

## II. Budgets and funding for 2022

## Total budget

3. In October 2021, at its seventy-second session, the Executive Committee approved an original annual budget of $\$ 8,993.7$ million for $2022 .{ }^{2}$ The final 2022 budget of $\$ 10,714.0$ million represents the sum of the approved original budget of $\$ 8,993.7$ million and the supplementary budgets of a total amount of $\$ 1,720.3$ million, established by the High Commissioner in the course of 2022, in accordance with article $7.4^{3}$ of the UNHCR financial rules and regulations. Details of the final 2022 budget are provided in annex I.

## Supplementary budgets

4. At the eighty-fifth meeting of the Standing Committee in September 2022, three supplementary budgets totalling $\$ 1,710.3$ million were approved, comprising $\$ 1,417.6$ million in support for the Ukraine situation; $\$ 233.9$ million for the Afghanistan situation in response to the critical humanitarian needs of internally displaced persons; $\$ 59.6$ million to enable the scale up of the emergency response in Cameroon and Chad, as part of the Cameroon situation. Subsequently, a supplementary budget of $\$ 10.0$ million was issued in response to the monsoon floods in Pakistan. This brings the total final supplementary budgets to $\$ 1,720.3$ million as of 31 December 2022. An overview of supplementary budgets by situation is provided in table II. 1 below. A more detailed

## Preliminary programme assessment

5. In 2022, the number of forcibly displaced rose to over 103 million people. UNHCR responded to high-risk and complex emergencies in 32 countries, with 52 internal emergency declarations, including 35 that were newly declared. The deployment of some 500 experts provided timely support to several operations, including in Ethiopia, Somalia, South Sudan, Ukraine and neighbouring countries. Against this backdrop, UNHCR strengthened its efforts in modernizing its information technology systems, processes and policies, adapting them to the dynamic environment in which the Office operates.
6. In the context of the armed conflict in Ukraine, the Office provided swift assistance to people in need, including the targeted distribution of shelter and core relief items, access to health care, initiatives to prevent or protect against gender-based violence, nutrition interventions, access to water, sanitation and hygiene, as well as protection services. The bulk of the provisional expenditure of $\$ 857.4$ million for the Ukraine situation was under impact areas 2 (Respond) and 1 (Protect) at 94.1 per cent and 4.4 per cent respectively, mostly for multi-purpose cash assistance and the distribution of non-food items.

## Preliminary year-end financial analysis

7. The impact area distribution of the final budget for 2022 of $\$ 10,714.0$ million is shown in table II. 2 below.

8. The final budget of $\$ 10,714.0$ million for 2022 comprises programmed activities of $\$ 10,274.5$ million; an operational reserve of $\$ 427.5$ million and $\$ 12.0$ million for Junior Professional Officers as also shown in annex 1.
9. The preliminary financial analysis for 2022 based on provisional figures, pending the financial closure of accounts, is described below and summarized in table II.3.
10. The provisional amount of funds available for the period ending 31 December 2022 stood at $\$ 6,130.6$ million. This amount comprised:

- $\quad \$ 235.3$ million carried over from the budget year 2021;
- $\$ 5,835.8$ million in voluntary contributions recorded in 2022, plus $\$ 217.7$ million recorded in prior years for activities with implementation in 2022, minus $\$ 231.5$ million recorded in 2022 for activities with implementation in future years;
- $\quad \$ 42.2$ million allotted to UNHCR from the United Nations regular budget;
- $\$ 31.0$ million currently estimated in other funds available and adjustments, mainly prior-year cancellations and adjustments, and miscellaneous income.

11. When compared to the $\$ 5,153.3$ million available in 2021, the provisional amount of funds available in 2022 increased by $\$ 977.3$ million, or 18.9 per cent.
12. Comparing the total funds available of $\$ 6,130.6$ million for 2022 with the total final needs of $\$ 10,714.0$ million for the same year, the funding gap amounts to $\$ 4,583.4$ million, or 42.8 per cent of the total final needs.
13. Provisional expenditure amounted to $\$ 5,599.3$ million, a record high for UNHCR. This is $\$ 681.3$ million or approximately 13.9 per cent more than the $\$ 4,918.0$ million expenditure in 2021.
14. The carry-over into 2023 is projected to be $\$ 531.3$ million, consisting only of funds earmarked to specific operations.

## III. Overview of $\mathbf{2 0 2 3}$

## Total requirements

15. The original annual budget for 2023 approved by the Executive Committee at its seventy-third plenary session in October 2022, was $\$ \$ 10,211.3$ million. ${ }^{4}$

## Supplementary budgets

16. As of 31 January, the cut-off date for this report, the High Commissioner has established two supplementary budgets for 2023 amounting to $\$ 305.8$ million: $\$ 250.0$ million for the Ukraine situation and $\$ 55.8$ million for the Pakistan flood situation. This brings the total current budget for 2023 to $\$ 10,417.1$ million. A breakdown of 2023 supplementary budgets by situation, region and impact area are shown in annex III(b).

## Budget reduction

17. The 2023 annual budget for Iraq was $\$ 339.9$ million in the original budget. This amount was reduced by $\$ 100.0$ million to $\$ 239.9$ million, reflecting the alignment of the UNHCR programme with the United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework, with an increased focus on inclusion in development interventions and national planning. Over the coming years, UNHCR will increase its support towards strengthening the capacities of public institutions to deliver relevant services.

## Impact areas

18. The 2023 original and current budget are presented in Table III. 1 below by impact area. It shows the net effect of the two supplementary budgets, the budget reduction in the Iraq operation, as well as internal transfers and adjustments made by the High Commissioner in accordance with financial rule 208.2. ${ }^{5}$ As a result of these adjustments, there has been a $\$ 160.8$ million or 6.6 per cent increase in the budget allocated to impact area 1, Attaining favourable protection environments. Detailed figures for the original and current budget for 2023 are provided in annex VII.

The response of Member States at the Ad hoc Committee of the General Assembly for the Announcement of Voluntary Contributions to the High Commissioner's Programme (Pledging Conference), held in December 2022, confirmed a sustained commitment to supporting the vital programmes of UNHCR. Initial pledges for 2023 reached $\$ 1,135$ million. Although this amount does not cover the entirety of the assessed needs of persons of concern to UNHCR, it enables the Office to plan and continue operations that provide life-saving assistance and protection without interruption. Donors are encouraged to continue to respond generously to the High Commissioner's appeal for resources to meet the requirements for 2023, including through unearmarked funds.

## Draft decision on budgets and funding for 2022 and 2023

## The Standing Committee,

Recalling the Executive Committee's decisions, at its seventy-third session on administrative, financial and programme matters (A/77/12/Add.1, para. 13(c)) as well as its discussions under the programme budgets and funding item at the eighty-fifth meeting of the Standing Committee in September 2022,

Reaffirming the importance of greater responsibility-sharing in solidarity with countries hosting refugees,

Recalls that the Executive Committee, at its seventy-second session, approved original programmes and budgets for regional programmes, global programmes and headquarters under the UNHCR 2022 annual programme budget, amounting to \$8,993.7 million,

Notes that the final 2022 supplementary budgets amounted to $\$ 1,720.3$ million for programmes benefiting the UNHCR programmes and projects,

Takes note of the increase in the UNHCR annual budget for 2022 to a final total of $\$ 10,714.0$ million, representing the sum of the original budget of $\$ 8,993.7$ million and the final supplementary budgets of $\$ 1,720.3$ million,

Recalls that the Executive Committee, at its seventy-third session in October 2022, approved original programmes and budgets for regional programmes, global programmes and headquarters under the UNHCR 2023 annual programme budget, amounting to $\$ 10,211.3$ million (A/AC.96/1224),

Takes note of the increase in the UNHCR annual budget for 2023 at a current total of $\$ 10,417.1$ million as of 31 January 2023, representing the sum of the original budget of $\$ 10,211.3$ million, supplementary budgets of $\$ 305.8$ million and a budget reduction of $\$ 100.0$ million,

Recognizes that emergencies and unforeseen activities unfolding in 2023 may result in the need for additional or expanded supplementary budgets and that additional resources, over and above those for existing budgets, would be needed to meet such needs, and

Urges member States to continue to respond generously, in the spirit of solidarity and in a timely manner, to the High Commissioner's appeal for resources to meet in full the annual budget for 2023.
