During the 1970s and 1980s, Argentina, Brazil and Chile experienced a rupture in their democratic orders with repression and persecution at the hands of military juntas that displaced tens of thousands of their nationals, many of whom sought asylum in other Latin American countries, such as Mexico. With the subsequent return to democracy, these countries have championed human rights and refugee protection. In a year of multiple commemorations, the event will focus on the solid refugee regime that today characterizes the Southern Cone, based on the respective national experiences of the past.
