Global Report 2013

UNHCR's Global Report 2013 provides information for governments, private donors, partners and other readers interested in the organization's activities and achievements.

The report describes UNHCR's work in 2013 to protect and improve the lives of some 42.9 million people around the world - refugees, internally displaced people, returnees, stateless people and others of concern. It highlights the achievements of the year, as well as the challenges faced by the organization and its partners.

UNHCR relies almost entirely on voluntary contributions to fund its programmes, with the exception of a small assessed contribution from the United Nations regular budget. All governmental donors who have contributed USD 150,000 or more, and all private sector donors who have contributed USD 100,000 or more, are profiled.

This report acknowledges with deep appreciation the generosity of donors, as well as that of the hosting countries and their populations who open their doors to refugees escaping

conflict or persecution. UNHCR is extremely grateful to all who help the organization in different ways to deliver protection and emergency response, and to find durable solutions for millions of uprooted people. This report provides information in different forms. What is important to remember is that, behind the bare statistics, financial figures and results matrices, there are people. So, throughout the main chapters, there are examples of human stories about families and individuals who benefitted from this support in 2013.

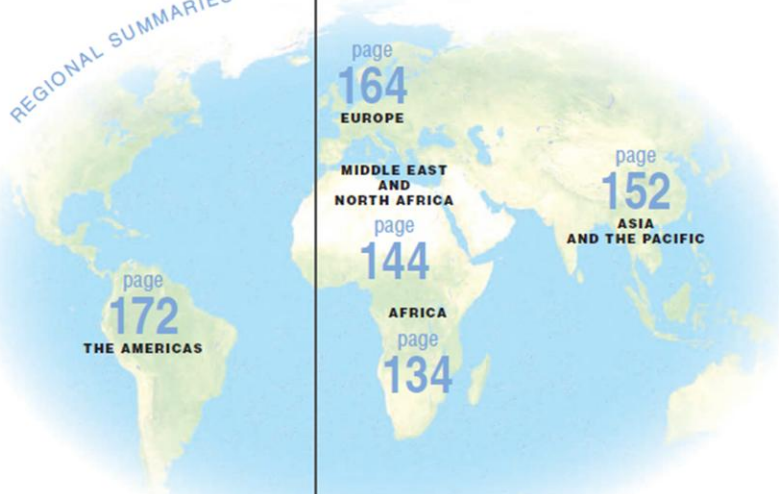

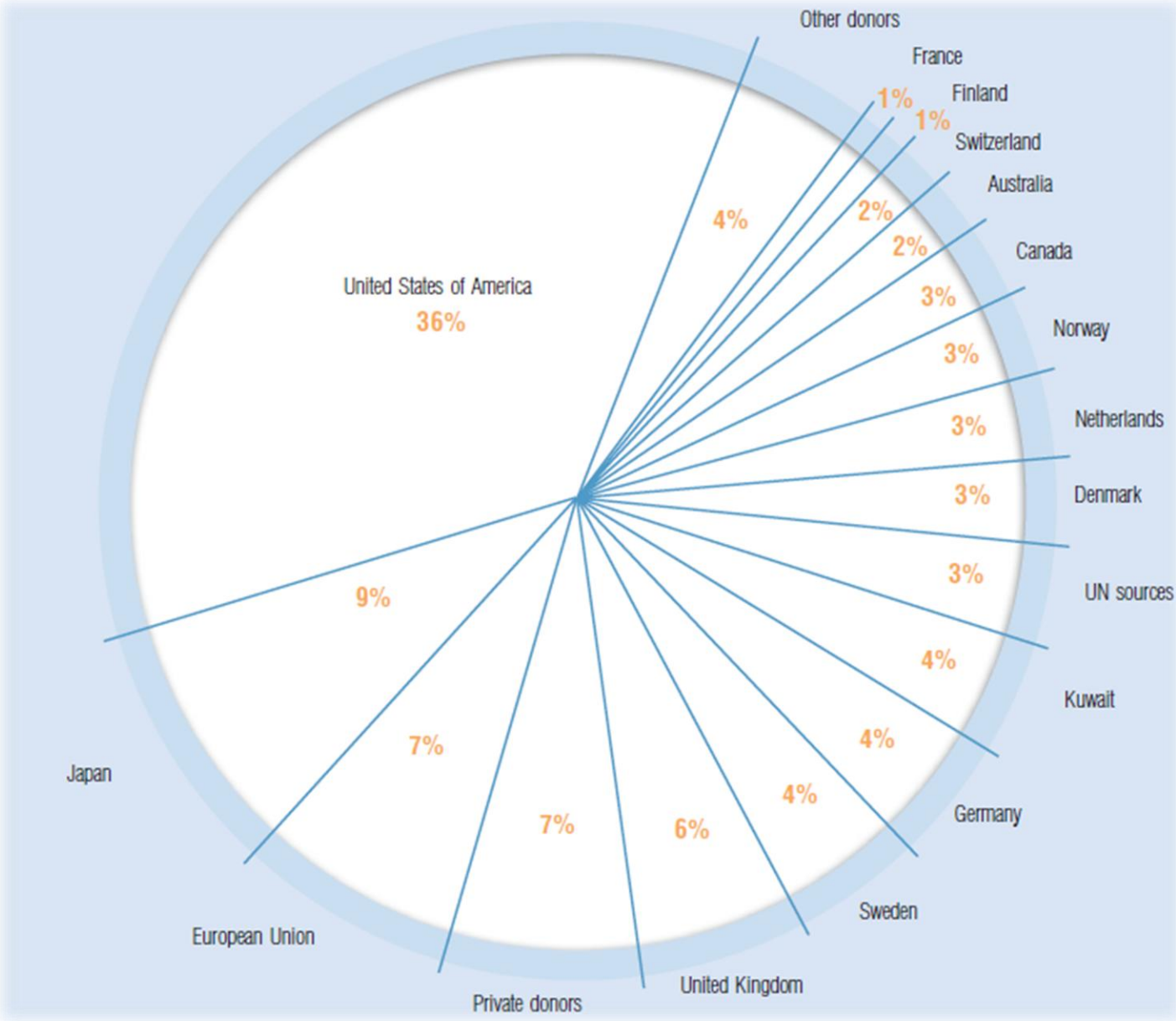
